Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

I will make you a light to the nations,
that my salvation may reach to the ends
of the earth.

— Isaiah 49:6b

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday the Church's calendar begins the Ordinary Time and we cannot speak of it without keeping in mind Sunday. As the Church will remind us, the every seven-day celebration of the Lord's Day is the fundamental structure upon which the Church's Year is built. The great liturgical seasons of Advent-Christmas and Lent-Easter are more expansive celebrations of particular aspects of the one paschal mystery which we celebrate every Lord's Day. These special seasons focus our attention upon critical dimensions of one mystery, a mystery so overwhelming that we are compelled to separate its various elements for particular attention. These seasons in no way minimize the critical importance of the Sunday celebration throughout the rest of the year. Hence, Ordinary Time is not very ordinary at all. Ordinary Time, the celebration of Sunday, is the identifying mark of the Catholic Christian Community which comes together remembering that on the first day of the week the Lord of Life was raised up and creation came at last to completion. Sunday as a day of gathering of families to play, eat and worship together is a sacrament of a redeemed time. How we live Sunday proclaims to the world that we believe about redeemed time now and for ever.

What happens in our church every Sunday is the fruit of our week. What happens as the fruit of the week past is the beginning of the week to come. Sunday, like all the sacraments, is simultaneously a point of arrival and departure for Christians on their way to the fullness of the kingdom. Again, this is not ordinary at all. This is the fabric of Christian living. (Excerpts from the ORDO 2014)

Let us now reflect on the Gospel reading for this Sunday. As John identifies Jesus as the "Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world," as this is what we say in the Mass. During the breaking of the bread we pray to Jesus under this title, begging him to grant us peace and mercy. These words invite all of us to Communion, where they are combined with a reference to the "Supper of the Lamb" spoken of in the book of Revelation. These familiar words as we go on further, remind us that the one who takes away our sins is the Servant of God who, as Prophet Isaiah says, was led like a lamb to be slaughtered. And this is the servant of whom Prophet Isaiah speaks in this Sunday's first reading, the one who will be a light to the nations and a source of revelation for all people. When we implore mercy and peace from Christ the Lamb at the Eucharist, we are reminded both of the Suffering Servant of God as well as the triumphant Lamb of Revelation. These words that are often spoken in the liturgy contain the mystery at the heart of our faith and belief. Namely, the saving strength is shown and manifested in the most gentle image of a lamb, the heavenly feast is present in a simple but meaningful sharing of the signs of bread and wine.

Let us begin the Sundays in Ordinary Time to follow the Gospel of Matthew's story of the life and ministry of our Lord, Jesus. Because it is through him that we have been sanctified and called to lives of holiness and sanctity.

Jesus, the Lamb of God, our giver of peace, let us share in your sacrifice so that we may become partakers of your victory. Amen.

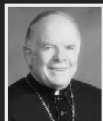

Parish Policies

Parish Registration ... To be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish, it is necessary to be registered, and to show your presence and support by attendance at Mass and through the regular use of offertory envelopes.

If you have questions regarding Parish Registration, please call 732-938-5375 or email frontoffice@sienachurch.org.

If you move or change addresses or parishes, please notify the Parish Office in a timely manner.

Young adults ...who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, **should register with the Parish under their own name.**

Weddings ... Please call the Parish Office **one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.).**

Baptisms ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Prior to the birth of the child, attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents, and sponsors/godparents also are encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information, contact the parish office.

Sponsorship ... In order to be a sponsor/godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... **also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months.** One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
