

Dear Parishioners.

Today we celebrate the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, the King of the Universe. This Feast of Jesus is a relatively recent addition to the liturgical calendar. It was instituted in 1925 by Pope Pius XI in response to the fast moving trend of secularism and materialism. We have to keep in mind the fundamental belief that Jesus Christ, the Lord who is Risen, is the essential life- sustaining and life-giving force that controls and governs all creation both as king and as shepherd.

As we pray at the opening prayers for this Mass, we find that Jesus is addressed as "King of the Universe," "King of Creation," "Universal King." His Kingdom is of "Truth and Life," "Holiness and Grace," and "Justice, Love, and Peace." If we take a look at them, it appears that they are in contrast to the theme of Kingship. Clearly, the Scripture readings today focus on the image of Jesus as shepherd and the final judgment.

Through the prophet Ezekiel who wrote during the Babylonian exile approximately 600 years before the birth of Jesus, God is portrayed as a shepherd, tending and rescuing the sheep who have scattered. God is frequently presented as the good shepherd, who intervenes to save his sheep. God must shepherd the people because those who were appointed to the task have failed. How can a shepherd do this? It can only come about when the shepherd is the Lord our God.

St. Paul had a great reason to address his message to the people of Corinth. Corinth was an extremely bustling commercial center where just about anything could be bought or sold. For the people of Corinth, the strong temptation to fall back into their old ways was always present.

St. Paul reminded them of their dignity as believers in the Risen Lord, and that they would be held accountable at the final judgment for the way they chose to live their lives.

The story told in the Gospel reading puts that judgment in its proper perspective. The shepherd-king judges on the basis of how closely we have molded ourselves on God's own way of acting. Some important questions we have to ask: Have we guarded the members by giving food to the hungry and drink to the thirsty, welcoming the stranger and clothing the naked? Have we conducted ourselves in a manner that would identify us as members of God's flock, or have we acted like those bad kings and leaders that would exploit those who put their care for their own gain?

Lord Jesus, our King, Shepherd and Guide, look over us as your flock. We ask you to protect us from all danger and harm and lead us safely home. Amen.

Homebound Ministry If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, contact the Parish Office.

The **St. Vincent de Paul Society** is a world wide Catholic Lay Organization. The SVDP Society here at our Parish assist people that live within our Parish Boundaries who fall on hard times. They do a home visit to determine if with the assistance from SVDP they can move forward. They help people that hit a bump in the road and are employed or receive enough disability to support their expenses. All of the payments are made directly to the landlord or utility company. No funds are given directly to the client.

SVDP is dependent on you, our parishioners, for our funds. They receive the 2nd collection when there are 5 weekends in the month (4-5 times a year). They also receive donations made to the poor box in the foyer and from the SVDP Envelopes in the back of the church. Some parishioners opt to make donations through Parish Pay. More often than not, they have to reach out to other churches for financial assistance with cases that exceed their funds.

Their fiscal year ended September 30th 2014. Dennis O'Brien, their treasurer, completed their Annual Report outlining the assistance they provided last year. SVDP Members will be handing out this report after Mass today. Please take the time to read it and see the work the SVDP Society was able to do because of your kind and generous donations.

If you would like to attend a meeting and possibly consider joining their ministry, they meet the 2nd Monday of every month from 7:30-8:30 pm in the Parish Hall. New members are always needed and welcomed!

Parish Registration ... To be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish, it is necessary to be registered, and to show your presence and support by attendance at Mass and through the regular use of offertory envelopes.

If you have questions regarding Parish Registration, please call 732-938-5375 or email frontoffice@sienachurch.org.

If you move or change addresses or parishes, please notify the Parish Office in a timely manner.

Young adults ...who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, **should register with the Parish under their own name.**

<u>Weddings</u> ... Please call the Parish Office one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.).

Baptisms ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance.

Prior to the birth of the child, attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents, and sponsors/godparents also are encouraged to attend. Classes are held in the Church at 7:30 P.M. on the third Wednesday of each month. For more information, contact the parish office.

Sponsorship ... In order to be a sponsor/godparent for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully ... also, be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. One month's notice is desirable when requesting a Sponsor Certificate, a Letter of Recommendation for Parochial School, and other items of this nature.
