

The Baptism of the Lord

All you who are thirsty, come to the water!

- Isaiah 55:1

Dear Parishioners,

As the Christmas Season concludes this Sunday, I would like to express my deepest gratitude to our generous parishioners and friends who have remembered and sent me Christmas cards, money, cookies and much more. Due to their sheer volume I was not able to send thank you cards, but your goodness cannot be outdone. Also, a big thank you to everyone who responded to our invitation and call to make our Christmas celebrations meaningful and full of spirit. Our decorations are done beautifully, which made the season more wonderful. A Special word of thanks to our volunteers through the leadership of our Sacristan and the buildings and grounds committee. We truly appreciate the time, effort and talents they have dedicated. Thank you so much.

This Sunday is the Feast of the Baptism of Jesus. It is a mystery worthy of our contemplation and meditation. If we were to ask an average Catholic what they think of when they hear the word BAPTISM, most would answer, "Baptism takes away original sin." Sometimes we speak of it as dying and rising with Christ. These ways of thinking and speaking about what happens in baptism are true and important. But reflection on the event of Jesus' baptism opens up new perspectives on our own baptism. In baptism we, like Jesus, are anointed with God's Spirit and declared to be God's beloved sons and daughters, with whom God is well pleased. In baptism too we see the heavens torn open and the ways of God made manifest to us. In baptism we too conquer the world through faith.

We also have to be aware that in baptism, we like Jesus, are given a commission. The Spirit anoints us as priests, prophets, and kings; in these roles we are called to lives of prayer, proclamation, and service. We are called, as the Prophet Isaiah tells us, to "seek the Lord while he may be found" and to "call on while he is near." In other words, in our baptism we are given a share in the saving work of our Lord.

Surprisingly, of course, this may sound quite daunting. It is daunting to think that every child or adult who is baptized is given the task of sharing in Jesus' priestly, prophetic and royal ministries. We should not be Overwhelmed. Why? Because at Jesus' baptism the heavens are torn open and the Spirit is poured out. We do nothing on our own. We do all through God's Spirit.

So here are the questions for us to ponder: How do I concretely share in Jesus' ministry of prayer, proclamation, and service? Do I pray and rely on the Spirit to help me in fulfilling the call I received in baptism to share in the ministry of Jesus?

A statement from the Diocese of Trenton

Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., underwent surgery, Dec. 29, in a Trenton area hospital to remove his left foot, ankle and part of his lower left leg reaching halfway between the knee and the ankle. The surgery was needed to address several serious infections brought about by complications with his diabetes.

Bishop O'Connell's surgery was described as successful by his surgeons, and his recovery is going well. He will remain in the hospital for a brief period of observation, and then will be moved to a local rehabilitation center. He is expected to make a full recovery, and will be fitted for a prosthesis at a time to be determined by his doctors.

We ask members of the community to pray for Bishop O'Connell in the coming weeks and months, as he recovers and completes his rehabilitation.
