Dear Parishioners,

Once a year we have someone who does a Mission Appeal in our parish. We are happy to welcome Rev. Father Cesar Echegaray from the Diocese of Kalibo in the southern part of the Philippines. He will be preaching next weekend at all of the Masses. Father Cesar will share their mission and plight of the poor in the Diocese as he represents the Most Rev. Jose Corazon Tala-oc, D.D., of the Diocese of Kalibo.

The main objective of his appeal is for the relief operations and rehabilitation of the malnourished children and the less fortunate, for the formation of lay leaders who will be sent to evangelize the unchurched in rural areas, and for the healing missions such as medical, dental and optical for very poor families who cannot afford health services, buy medicines and pay for hospitalization.

It is quite disturbing to know that most of the poor people who live in the villages are unchurched and they are located in the hinterlands. Unfortunately, they are visited by strong storms annually which destroy their crops and houses.

As your Pastor, I encourage and appeal for your generosity in monetary contributions to show our oneness and compassion with the beneficiaries of the Mission Appeal. Let us pray for the success of Father Echegaray's endeavor as he presents to us his preaching about his mission this first weekend of August. Thank you so much for your support, kindness and generosity.

This Sunday's readings, most particularly the Gospel, are all about the multiplication of loaves and fishes which stirs a belief in the people that Jesus is the prophet foretold by Moses and a general desire to make him their king. But their enthusiasm stems from a worldly vision. They have not recognized the spiritual significance of what he has done. His kingdom is not of this world and he withdraws into the solitude of the hills.

From time immemorial, people of religious faith have seen the hills, valleys and mountains as signifying the meeting of heaven and earth. In the Bible, those meetings took definitive form. At Mt. Horeb, Moses received God's revelation from the middle of the burning bush; on Sinai he received the Ten Commandments directly from God. To Elijah at Mt. Horeb God was revealed not in mighty wind, earthquake or fire, but in a gentle breeze. Jesus went into the hills to pray. He fasted in a mountainous wilderness, was transfigured on a mountain and preached the Sermon on the Mount.

When a small boy gave Jesus the loaves and fishes, heaven and earth met on a mountainside. From his poverty the boy gave him all he had and Jesus transformed it into an offering beyond all understanding. Jesus said that unless we change and become like little children we shall never enter the kingdom of heaven. The little boy shows us how to change that we might live forever with the Lord on his holy mountain. Amen.
