Dear Parishioners,

Today is the First Sunday of Advent and as part of our preparation for the great Feast of Christmas, we are going to continue with our Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament, and Evening Prayers and concluding with Benediction. We initiated this religious activity a few years ago and we always do it in the Chapel starting at 7 PM. Everyone is invited to participate and be an important part of this event on all Sundays of Advent. Refreshments and fellowship follows after the prayers in the Basement of the worship place.

Although our culture and society has already begun its preparations for the Birth of the Lord, similarly, the Church has already planned for this great celebration. The Church's liturgy, however, wants us to know that we are not only getting ready for a special celebration three weeks from now, but as we hear from our readings, we see the bigger picture. As we can see it's not just the celebration of Jesus' birth that we have to prepare for but we must also prepare for the day when he comes again to bring us into his kingdom. Advent tells and reminds us that Christ is coming. Are we ready to meet him?

As we learn from the Gospel, Jesus makes it clear that one day the whole of creation will come to an end. Just as everyday things come to an end on a small scale, so the whole of creation will come to an end on a very big scale. "That day will be sprung on you suddenly, like a trap." That happens to each of us individually, at the hour of our death. But it will also happen one day to everything that exists.

Likewise, Jesus teaches us that we will be called to give an account of our stewardship of all the gifts he has given us. Through baptism we are called to build up the Kingdom of God in this world, and to look forward to eternal life with God, a great time for us now to reflect on whether we are making proper use of the blessings and the gifts God has given, both material as well as spiritual.

The gospel's suggestion for us today as we begin Advent is: "Be vigilant at all times and pray." Is there a better formula we can apply to this season to prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth or the coming of Christ at the end of our lives or at the end of time?

Being vigilant and praying means keeping an awareness of spiritual realities, being mindful of the brevity of life and the reality of eternity. Hence we stay vigilant by living a prayerful, sacramental life. And in so doing, we share in the prayers and good works of every other member of the Church spread all over the world.

As we conclude, we have the great example of the prayers of Our Dear Mother Mary to assist us. "Mary treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart." Amen.
