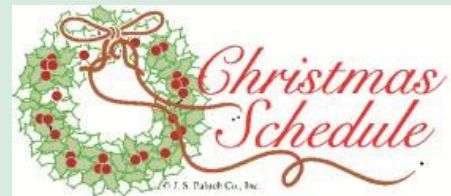

Dear Parishioners,

This Sunday morning we are going to have the Fourth Sunday of Advent.

We might be wondering and ask the question, what is faith? A lot of us would immediately respond that faith refers to those truths we normally profess when we recite the creed. However, faith has another meaning, something that is personal and private. Faith is not only mental acceptance of truths. We have to be aware that faith is also a personal trust. In fact, the Creed itself would indicate this in its opening statement, Not, "I believe that ..." but, "I believe in one God...." The one we believe in, whom we trust is no other than God.

If we look in our own faith-journey, we would find that the greatest model of this trusting faith is the lady the Church places before us in today's Gospel, Mary, the trusting and faith-filled mother of our Lord and Savior.

As we can easily see, the kind of trusting Mary had, portrays a model of faith that is always open to God. She truly believes in God's love for her and in his promises; she consequently gives herself wholly over to him .

Mary's faith however, is not blind at all, for she questioned and doubted. How can this be? Mary asked the angel who announced to her that she was to be the mother of God's Son. What she questioned was not so much God, but what her own ability to understand God and his plan was for her. But even in the midst of confusion, Mary confessed that God knew best, even though she could not understand what he was about. "May it be done according to your word," she responded to the angel.

Mary has proven that her assent to God's plan for her was not a one-time event. She lived this real faithfulness every day forward from that moment, in the midst of joy, challenges and sufferings.

In our world today, can there be any doubt that it is this trusting faith of Mary that we need? We need the kind of faith that Mary had, the faith she models for us. That faith which continues to trust in God amid the events in our world. Amen.

Are we making special efforts to put his teaching into practice in our lives? If we say he is good news to us, are we good news to the people with whom we live and work? The Word became flesh and lived among us so that he could become flesh in every age, everywhere in every one of us. Amen.

Christmas 2017 Worship Notes

Christmas (a holy day of obligation) falls on a Monday this year so please take note of the following in chronological order. It is necessary to attend **TWO Masses** in order to satisfy both the Sunday obligation and the Christmas holy day obligation.

- Vigil Mass on Saturday, December 23 at 4:30 PM satisfies the Sunday obligation and does not satisfy the Christmas obligation.
- Sunday Masses on December 24 at 8:00, 10:00, and 11:30 AM satisfy the Sunday obligation and do not satisfy the Christmas obligation.
- Christmas Vigil Masses on Sunday, December 24 at 4:00 PM, 6:00 PM & Midnight satisfy the Christmas obligation and do not satisfy the Sunday obligation.
- For example, if one goes to Saturday, December 23 at 4:30 PM and the Sunday, December 24 Mass at 4:00 PM, then that person has satisfied the Sunday obligation and the Christmas holy day obligation.
- For example, if one goes to the Sunday, December 24 Mass at 4:00 PM and to no other Mass on Sunday morning the 24th nor to a Vigil Mass on Saturday the 23rd, then that person has satisfied the Christmas obligation but not the Sunday obligation.
- Since the solemnity of Mary, Mother of God on Monday, January 1, 2018 is not a holy day of obligation this coming year, we will still have regular 9 AM Mass in the Chapel.

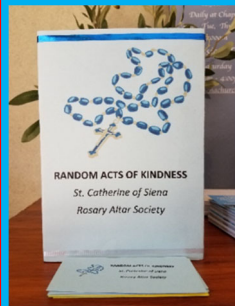

In order to serve you better, we ask that you please take a few moments to register, to be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish. To register and receive offertory envelopes for your tax deductible donations or to inquire about our various ministries please call 732-938-5375 or email us at frontoffice@sienachurch.org. For address or other changes, including a change in Parish, please call the Parish Office. We look forward to meeting you and seeing you at our services. Thank you and God Bless.

Young Adults ... who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, should register with the Parish under their own name.

Weddings ... Please call the Parish Office *one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.).*

Baptisms ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up you must fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend or email deacondan@sienachurch.org.

Recommendation for Sponsorship ...
