Dear Parishioners,

This Wednesday, October 4 at 7 P.M. in the Church's parking lot, there is going to be a blessing of animals as we commemorate St. Francis of Assisi who is the Patron Saint of Nature and of Animals. Please take your pets as we bless and pray for them.

Today is the 26th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Let me begin my reflection by sharing with you a story of a rabbi who was right there standing in the synagogue and began to pray in the traditional way of the Jewish faith, tilting forwards and backwards with words spoken in a rhythm with the body's movement. As he moved, with his feet firmly on the ground, he began to chant his prayer: "I am nothing, I am nothing at all." At some point during the prayer a cantor in the synagogue joined the rabbi in his heartfelt prayer, and before long two voices were making the same prayer in chant, "I am nothing, I am nothing at all."

As they continue the chant, the synagogue's janitor came into the main hall and witnessed the two men offering up their prayer to God. So the janitor got in line with the two other men, joined his voice to theirs chanting, "I am nothing, I am nothing at all." At this point the rabbi turned to the cantor and said, "Look at him, who does he think he is?"

Does it matter who the story is told about? It could be just a Catholic Pastor or Bishop. The point of the story is that we are all able to allow ourselves to fall into the trap of not realizing and recognizing our own faults and sinfulness. In fact we can all pray, "I am nothing, nothing at all," but the moment we take ownership of that virtuous anthem, hence we fail to see the meaning of prayers. Consequently we are putting ourselves very far from God's forgiveness, mercy and benevolence.

It is from experience that people receive God's will in different ways. In the end, responses boil down to just one, either one obeys God's will or rejects it. We can see it so well in the Parable of the Two Sons. A man had two sons... and so begins the interrogation. Both the sons in the parable answer their father: one chooses not to tell the truth saying he will go to work, and in fact does not: while the other son tells the truth, that he does not want to go, but later on changes his mind, and goes and does the work that his father has asked him. The important point Jesus is making is quite obvious; he does not allow us to carry on the journey without first understanding its meaning. Jesus goes on to tell them that when John the Baptist came among them, as a concrete example and model of "true righteousness," they, the people of religion and holy talk did not believe him. Truthfully, the tax collectors and the prostitutes were making their way into the kingdom of God before them.

It is quite easy to imagine the reaction of Jesus' words among this people. It surely would not be difficult, too, for us to try to imagine our reaction to the words of Jesus if they were addressed to us. How we receive them depends on how we perceive ourselves, and others. It would be fitting to ask ourselves, are we respectable religious people, or do we know ourselves to be sinners? Just like the tax collectors and prostitutes of whom Jesus speaks of. We have to realize that everything depends on how we see ourselves, and how we see and judge ourselves.

There is no reason for us to become self-righteous with regard to our religion and our God. It was St. Paul who tells us the "kenosis." That is, even though Jesus was in the form of God, he emptied himself. We have to do the same, empty ourselves and let us allow God to fill us and rejoice and be happy that all people are saved. Amen.





Parish Registration ... WELCOME to the Saint Catherine of Siena Parish Family. In order to serve you better, we ask that you please take a few moments to register, to be recognized as a practicing member of the Parish. To register and receive offertory envelopes for your tax deductible donations or to inquire about our various ministries please call 732-938-5375 or email us at frontoffice@sienachurch.org. Young Adults ... who are still living at home with their parents, who have graduated from college, and/or who are employed full-time, should register with the Parish under their own name.

Weddings ... Please call the Parish Office *one year in advance of desired wedding date, BEFORE completing any other arrangements (reception hall, etc.)*.

Baptisms ... The Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the 2nd Sundays at 12:30 P.M. or can be celebrated during Sunday Mass. Arrangements must be made in advance. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up you must fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend or email deacondan@sienachurch.org.

Recommendation for Sponsorship ... In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (*showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes or the welcome envelopes located in the narthex*); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months.
