Dear Parishioners,

We would like to introduce to the parish community Laura Randazzo, our newly-appointed Pastor's Associate. As she has shown her capabilities, gifts and talents in past events and in taking care of the ministries in our parish, such as being the Coordinator of the Pastoral Council, being a member of the Faith in Our Future core team, and other programs which she introduced to make our parish more vibrant and active, we would also like her to assist us in the parish office. Her roles are quite distinct from the parish secretary as she is going to work and report directly to the Pastor. Her job is a non-paying job. We are happy to welcome her and I would that request you support and pray for her God given role in our Church.

This week November 1st is the Feast of All Saints. A friendly reminder that it is a holy day of obligation. Both of our Masses are in the Church, at 9 AM and 7 PM. We can learn a lot from our Holy Men and Women of the Church. Among them were people who died when they were young or old, some were married or single, religious or priests. They were people from every walk of life, wealthy and poor. They believed in God's love, they made loving God as the center of their own lives. Some even went as far as offering their lives for the faith, for martyrdom, for God. In today's Feast, the Church not only wants us to remember all these holy people, but the Church puts them before us as guides on our own way to God. It gives us comfort and consolation knowing that our relatives and friends who have gone before us and who have died in God's grace now enjoy the fullness of God's life and happiness. Let us keep in mind that God has called us all to a life of holiness. God has called us all to become saints.

Today is the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

Reflecting on the readings we have, St. Paul commends the community of Thessalonica for the way in which they have faithfully followed the Gospel life he had taught them. They have done this so well to the point that they become an example for others, not only the neighboring communities. Certainly, this is the way that evangelization meant to work, by the witness of transformed lives. The Christian community of Thessalonica did what God's chosen people had failed to achieve in all the centuries before. Obviously, the secret lies in the greatest commandment of the Law as Jesus said: "You must love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind"; and "You must love your neighbor as yourself."

There is an American missionary to China who offers an incredible story all about "Love is a Costly Thing." He truly remembers: "She was lying on the ground. In her arms she held a tiny baby girl. As I put a cooked sweet potato into her outstretched hand. I wondered if she would live until morning. Her strength was almost gone, but her tired eyes acknowledged my gift. The sweet potato could help so little, but it was all I had. Taking a bite she chewed it carefully. Then, placing her mouth over her baby's mouth, she forced the soft warm food into the tiny throat. Although the mother was starving, she used the entire potato to keep her baby alive. Exhausted from her effort, she dropped her head on the ground and closed her eyes. In a few minutes the baby was asleep. I later learned that during the night the mother's heart stopped, but her little girl lived."

My friends, God in his love for us and for a fallen world spared not his own Son to tell the world of his love. We must tell the whole world at any cost. Do we love enough?

We are to love with all our heart and soul and mind, hence we are bound to be touched by the challenges that are perpetrated all around us every given day. We will be moved with compassion as God is moved with compassion and we will respond to our neighbor's need. It is important to realize that when the Christian community responds with prayer and practical help to the challenges and trials of our times, then it will truly be a light for all the nations to see. Therefore, we will be teaching the Gospel by the concrete example of our lives as we continue to build God's kingdom here on earth. Amen.

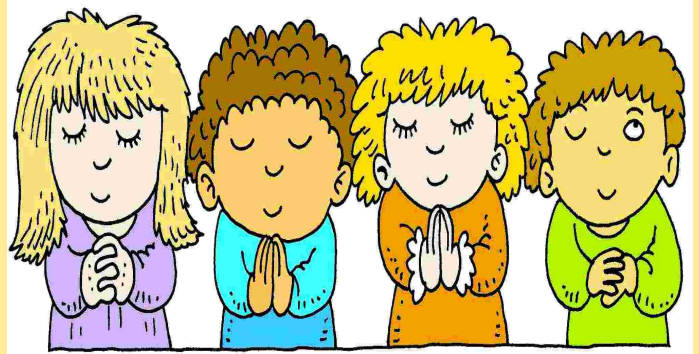

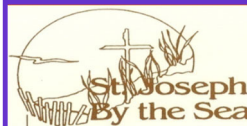
