

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.




Homebound Ministry

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is Hospitality Sunday. Our ministry members, who take care of this wonderful event, are a great example for the community as they promote friendship, camaraderie and oneness. Let us value their endeavors and participate wholeheartedly as we get together in the Parish Hall after all the Masses this Sunday. Nourish and fill yourself up with the food and drinks they have prepared for you. Have fun and enjoy the fellowship.

This Wednesday, August 29, our new catechists/aides are going to have their training in preparation for the upcoming Religious Education Program. We wish them a wonderful year ahead.

Twenty First Sunday of the Year

As I looked back more than twenty years ago, at my parish assignment up in North Jersey, I was always amazed and very impressed with the families who were so involved in Mass Ministries. The children would be altar servers, the mother would be the reader of the Word of God and the father would be an Extraordinary Minister of the Eucharist. Isn't it wonderful to see the whole family on a given Sunday actively participating and serving in the Mass?

On several Sundays now, Christ has been speaking about giving himself to us in the Eucharist. And today he finally asks, "Do you accept this? Do you really appreciate what I have been telling you about Communion." In today's world, "have you considered me like a car salesman on TV"? Is it too much to take seriously? Would it be easier to leave politely rather than have to give an answer, rather than have to live up to the reality of the Eucharist?

To live up to the Eucharist means, among other things, seeing that through the Eucharist people become one with Christ. In fact, St. Paul gives us one fine example, or application, and he isn't speaking mere poetry. He is talking about some of the effects of seeing others as one with Christ through the Eucharist. If a wife sees her husband as "Eucharistic," she will offer respect to him. If a husband sees his wife as "Eucharistic," he will give himself for her. They will do this totally, caring for each other as they own their own bodies. "This sort of talk is hard to endure; how can anyone take it seriously"? Remember when you used to hear that "marriages are made in heaven"? Maybe the saying should be: no one comes in union with another except through Christ, and no one comes to Christ unless brought by the heavenly Father.

Husbands and wives are the Church in miniature, an expression of the "Eucharistic" people of God. They can give a sample of how we should care for each other and can remind us that Christ's deep love for us is best seen in this total kind of love. Love is caring, protection, respect and growth.

To accept the fact that we are all bound to this type of love is difficult, but we must do so to accept the Eucharist. The teachings of Christ through the Church on divorce or abortion are easily digested when they don't apply to us. But for the poor parent and three children abandoned by the spouse, for the young girl discovering pregnancy outside marriage, the talk of the Church is hard to endure.

Would even the experience of seeing Christ in his glory, a vision of heaven, make some life situations any easier? Maybe not. A strong spirit must fill us, the spirit of Christ that comes to us through the Eucharist. It is a spirit which gives strength to a married person to live singly, for a young girl to have her child and then offer it for adoption.

Christ gives us the Eucharistic food, the strength to make difficult decisions. He gives us his presence as a friend. The Lord is close to the brokenhearted. He gives us his Spirit as counselor to see wisdom. But all this helps only if we believe. Some of the Jews left Christ because they could not believe in the Eucharist. But husbands and wives and families with faith can stay together and remain in the Church because of the Eucharist as well. Each of us can find help to cope with problems, and we are called to assist those around us who have still greater problems. Amen.

MESSAGE FROM THE BISHOP

"As Bishop of the Diocese of Trenton, I share with our faithful and clergy of the Diocese the revulsion, disgust and anger you feel at all the recent revelations of the sexual abuse of minors by clergy in past decades. Our Diocese has not been spared its own experience of similar past abuses for which, as Bishop, I could never adequately apologize to those affected, to those who have been so profoundly harmed. Although measures at future prevention have been put in place and all reports of the sexual abuse of minors by anyone in the Church are turned over to prosecutors, that is little consolation to those who have been harmed by the Church and its clergy. I offer my deepest, heartfelt apologies to them and to all the faithful and clergy whose faith has been shaken again. I pray daily for victims and survivors and for all of you, that "nothing will separate us from the love of God that comes to us in Christ Jesus, Our Lord (Romans 8: 39)."




