Dear Parishioners,

Today everyone is invited to meet and welcome new parishioners, chat with friends while having some coffee and snacks after the 10 and 11:30 AM Masses. Our Hospitality Ministry is more than happy to prepare some food and drink for camaraderie and fellowship to continue building up the parish community.

The Children's Liturgy Ministry which we started a few years ago is making a wonderful presence and progress at our Sunday Masses. Today, at the 11:30 AM Mass, once again we are having the little children come to the classroom and listen to the Word of God and our dedicated teachers are going to explain and share with them what the message is all about. We are calling on parents who have not brought their children yet to this solemn activity. The parish congregation will be glad to welcome you.

It is a rewarding experience having the Parish Office open and available to our Christian Community during Sundays from 9 AM to 12:45 PM. Our faithful and dedicated volunteers were able to enroll some new parishioners as well as attend to the needs of our people who wanted to purchase Mass cards over the past two Sundays. As we have announced before, starting March 1, we are going to have the Parish Office open on Mondays through Thursdays from 9 AM to 2 PM. Fridays we are closed. Please keep in mind that we are pleased to see Catholics who come to Church during the weekends and fulfill not only their Sunday obligation but to be with our Catholic family. If you know anyone who is a regular Church attendee but has not been registered in the parish, please remind them.

Today is the Second Sunday of Lent.

Last Sunday, we saw in the temptations of Jesus how our faith and convictions were always put to the test. Today, the Transfiguration of Jesus shows us the glory that awaits those who listen to God. Let us be mindful that, as with the First Sunday of Lent which always presents the story of the temptations of Jesus, the Second Sunday of Lent always relates the transfiguration story; "This is my beloved Son." We heard the gospel narrate that from a cloud came a voice. While the temptation of Jesus in the desert demonstrates the human condition of Jesus, the transfiguration story clarifies his divinity. As with the baptism of Jesus at the Jordan River, the voice of the Father affirms the sonship of Jesus. The Father presents Jesus as his Son, confirms his mission, and tells everybody: "Listen to Him."

For the disciples, the transfiguration of Jesus was an intense spiritual experience. They saw Jesus transfigured. They heard the voice of the Father. That experience had a profound impact on them and also signified a very important moment in their following of Jesus. Obviously, the disciples needed that experience.

Just like the disciples, we also need profound spiritual experiences. There is a need for us to feel God's presence in our lives. We need God's blessings and graces. We need God's forgiveness. In fact we are called to live out the experience of the disciples by listening to God in prayer, by contemplating and reflecting on the Word of God, by nourishing our life through the Eucharist. We need moments of transfiguration so that with renewed strength, we can come down from the mountain and go on through this valley of tears. Amen

LENTEN REGULATIONS


As we enter the Lenten Season, we offer a little refresher on what the Catholic Church in the United State requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Saturday this year.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18 to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27. However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.


