

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a Baptism Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes, the welcome envelopes located in the narthex, or via Weshare online giving); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the FIFTEENTH SUNDAY in Ordinary Time.

Our first reading today comes from the Book of the Prophet Amos. The Prophet Amos lived about 700 years before Christ. By that time, the Kingdom of God had been divided into two kingdoms. His prophetic message was to the Northern Kingdom that would soon be destroyed unless the people reformed their lives. His message of reform was not well received, as no one likes to be told that they are not living the way God wants them to live.

To have a correct understanding of today's passage, it helps us to know that at that time there were professional prophets, that is, some people made their living by telling people how to solve their problems, giving them advice, predicting the future, etc. These professional prophets were often servants of pagan gods, not servants of the God of Abraham. They usually spoke the kinds of things their clients would want to hear because if they offended or rebuked their client, they would not be able to receive their fee. Amos preached at the sanctuary in Bethel where there was a temple in competition with the Temple in Jerusalem.

The high priest in Bethel, Amaziah, mistook Amos for one of the professional prophets and told him to go back to Jerusalem where he came from. Amos protested that he was not a career prophet. He was able to explain patiently that he was living a nice quiet life as a farmer and was called by the one who called him to go to Bethel and warn the people that their sinful lives would lead to destruction. Today's first reading prepares us for the Gospel where Jesus sends his apostles to go out to preach and warns them that their message will not always be well received.

It is a nice thing to remember being out at recess during school and picking teams. It could be nerve-wracking for some, thinking about how that would turn out. Would we be chosen? Would someone pick us? Were we good enough? Perhaps many of us approach our faith and relationship with Jesus this way, asking God whether or not God will choose us, whether we're good enough to qualify for the call. Here is the good news for each of us today. God has already chosen us, and sends us out on a mission that we can accomplish through his grace, power and authority.

First, we are not alone in this mission. We have our brothers and sisters in Christ. Jesus sent out two by two, and we are encouraged to find others who can walk with us as we try hard to follow Jesus.

Secondly, it is not all up to us. Jesus is right here in our midst as we struggle, Jesus is giving us strength. He rejoices with us in our victories. He does not ask us to go out with only our natural abilities, but gives us enough energy, power, authority and grace. All we must do is to receive them.

Finally, Jesus will continue to choose us and work with and through us, even if we do not succeed. As the striking passage of the Gospel says, "the twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them." This simply means that Judas, who eventually betrayed Jesus, would have been included in that number. Judas, through the power and authority of Jesus, healed the sick, preached repentance and drove out demons. Amen.


