SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up, please fill out the **registration form** on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.


Sacrament of Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (*showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes or the welcome envelopes located in the narthex*); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.



Homebound Ministry


If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

As your Shepherd, it is my little and simple way of saying thank you so very much, for without you our parish life would not be so strong, vibrant and active as Jesus, the High Priest wants it to be. May God reward you with all his blessings as you continue to serve the parish community of St. Catherine of Siena.

A special word of thanks to the parish's Hospitality Ministry for their collective effort on putting this event together and stepping up to the plate and making this weekend a memorable and significant day with sumptuous meal, great camaraderie, meeting new friends and getting connected with each other as one family of God. I am immensely grateful to those families who have donated different kinds of food, as they offered their time and skill generously for the community. Thank you so much.

THE NATIVITY OF SAINT JOHN THE BAPTIST

Are there signs that appear at a child's birth that are indicative of what he or she will become? As we have learned, the ancient world believed that signs accompanied an important birth.

Today we are celebrating the birth of someone who showed signs that he was a prophet even before he was born. Now being one of God's prophets wasn't a safe calling. But then Jesus' life wasn't safe either. Usually, the liturgy celebrates saints on the day of their death and, in fact, only celebrates the birthdays of three people: Jesus, Mary and John the Baptist. But why is John the Baptist so significant and merit this honor? We ask because even at his birth his family is wondering as they inquire, "What will this child turn out to be?" Given the opportunity to look at the events and signs that surround his birth, we can begin to realize and appreciate why, as Jesus himself said, "of all the children born of women there is no greater than John the Baptist." (Mt. 11:11)

What made John the Baptist the greatest of all the prophets, as Jesus declared? Was it his personality? No. Was it the ascetical life that he lived? No. What made him the greatest of all the prophets was the role that he played in the incredible drama of salvation history. He was the one who heralded (Jesus') coming by proclaiming a baptism of repentance to all the people of Israel, as we heard in the Gospel today. He was the one who would point to Jesus as the Lamb of God. (Jn. 1:29)

It was the remarkable role of John the Baptist to point out the incredible reality of God's Word made flesh and dwelling among us. It was John the Baptist who showed us that God's chosen one, God's Christ, God's anointed, was actually here. No other prophet had that kind of privilege. No other prophet could point to God's living presence among us.

How can we celebrate this feast of John the Baptist's birthday? Of course, here at Mass, but also by heeding his words and putting into practice the lessons of his life. If we are going to recognize Jesus for what He is, then we must see Him against the long history of the Old Testament. We cannot appreciate the new without knowing what came before. We will then appreciate how Jesus fulfills what the prophets foretold. Once we have recognized Jesus as the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world, then we too need to repent and confess our failings so that he can heal us.

In conclusion, as Christians who have been sent to evangelize and to point the way to Christ, we need the humility of John the Baptist. For all Christians, not just those who are lay ministers, deacons or priests, are called to be sure that we are pointing to Christ and not to ourselves. We are also here to prepare for His coming. Amen.





Where Angels Play Foundation is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization founded in 2013. Inspired by tragic events of 9/11, Hurricane Katrina, Hurricane Sandy, and the Sandy Hook Elementary School shooting, Where Angels Play has found a beautiful way to honor young children who have left us too soon in the form of public community playgrounds. Each playground represents the personality and influence of the angel and provides a place of joy for the family and the community. Our first endeavor, The Sandy Ground Project, is a collection of 26 playgrounds along the coast of New Jersey, New York, and Connecticut, honoring each one of the victims from Sandy Hook Elementary School. As a pay it forward initiative, Where Angels Play has built 48 playgrounds to date in the United States, Canada, and most recently Africa.

All projects are funded by public and private donations and built by community volunteers. The playgrounds are designed by the family member of the angel being honored and are given as a gift to a community in need. Our future projects include Medford, MA for Boston Marathon bombing victim Krystle Campbell, victims of the Parkland, FL tragedy, and countless stories of both families and communities in need of joy and healing.




