

Pastor's Message

Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend the Missionaries of the Poor Lay Associates will be having their Food Drive Appeal for the M. O. P. Mission in Haiti. An important part of our Lenten devotion is to give alms to the less fortunate, the poor and the needy. Please listen to their talks at all the Masses as they make their appeal. Thank you so much in advance for your generosity and kindness to our brothers and sisters who are looking for help.

As we go on our Lenten Journey on the Paschal Mystery of Jesus, our dedicated parishioners have put together a short Lenten Series using a FORMED Program on Tuesday, March 13 at 7 P.M. and on March 22 also at 7 P.M. in the Parish Hall. Everyone is invited to attend as we are going to have exciting art movies as part of the presentation. Also there are some reflections, conversations and refreshments. Please be there as your presence would make a big difference to us.

We give a lot of credit to our ministry leaders as they step up and take the initiative of asking their members to bring some simple soup, salad and bread for the gathering in our Parish Hall prior to the Stations of the Cross, which is being held in the Church. I, as your Pastor, personally thank and appreciate the leadership of our laymen who are presiding at the Stations of the Cross. We are happy to see their enthusiasm and idealism as they pray and reflect with us that serve as a profound inspiration to our families and friends.

Today at the 11:30 A.M. Mass, once again we are having Children's Liturgy of the Word. As a friendly reminder to our parents and friends who have young children and have intention for their little kids to understand and learn God's Word and the celebration of the Holy Eucharist, please bring them to Church.

This Sunday is the Fourth Sunday of Lent.

It is interesting to see a cross or crucifix hang around the neck of countless people in our world who give no other outward sign of being religious. Many teachers of young children report that when they offer the youngsters a selection of holy cards and ask them to choose one, children would often times choose the picture of Jesus on the Cross.

Why do you think the cross and crucifix are so important, and so central? Because after two thousand years, has the cross, either bare or with the body of Jesus upon it, lost none of its fascination and power? The best answer is: the cross and crucifix are a depiction of how much God loves us, they are a revelation of how much he has loved us and desires a relationship with us.

So here is an interesting question. What is the shape of God's love? Maybe its shape is its shapelessness. For his love is beyond boundaries and we simply cannot wrap our hands around it. We cannot hold it in our hearts and hands. Rather, we must simply let ourselves be held by this boundless love that redeems us despite ourselves. I heard from a wonderful Theologian, "our faith is not about doing good, it is not even about being good; it is all about being loved." The day we grasp the truth of this is the day we will know God and know ourselves. Amen.

FROM THE DIOCESE

LENTEN REGULATIONS


As we enter the Lenten Season, we offer a little refresher on what the Catholic Church in the United State requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and ABSTINENCE</u> (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. *St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Saturday this year.*
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18 to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

Jesus, thank you for helping the blind man believe in you.


