PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is Hospitality Sunday, hence after the 10 and 11:30 Masses, everyone is expected to be at the Parish Hall for some fellowship, get-together, some refreshments and let us meet new parishioners in the community. As always, we cannot be thankful enough for our Hospitality Committee for we count on them as they do a great job in providing the necessary and important things to make our parish a more welcoming, warm and friendly place for everyone.

As a friendly reminder at the 11:30 Mass, we are having the Children's Liturgy of the Word. This is a great opportunity for our young kids to be in the Mass and listening and hearing the Word of God as our faithful catechists are explaining at their level of understanding, God's Holy Word coming from the Sacred Scriptures. This is a wonderful time for our young children to be in the Mass at the early stage of their lives.

We must be mindful of our brothers and sisters throughout the world of their sufferings most especially the poor people of Haiti. Today the Missionaries of the poor are coming to the community to ask for monetary donations. Please be as generous as you can. Thank you so much.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

This Sunday is the beginning of the holiest week of the year. The liturgy starts with a happy Gospel, recounting Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem and ending with the death of the One who was acclaimed a King a few days earlier.

The same crowd that was cheering him during the parade was jeering at him a few days later. They had been impressed by his sermons, fed with loaves and fishes; many had been cured and healed of their ailments. But as soon as the tide began to turn against Jesus, in no time, they did go with the tide. Their cries of "Hosanna" turned into shouts of a very different kind: "Crucify him!"

Here is an interesting question: Is Holy Week, then, only about violence and humiliation? No doubt, violence and humiliation form part of the scenery. However, we should look deeper; we should look beyond this violence and humiliation. Beyond it we discover that the events of Holy week are much more about love and humility.

That is why on Palm Sunday we read about the powerful hymn in St. Paul's letter to the Philippians. It sings of Jesus, who was God, dwelling in heavenly glory, but who freely plunged to the depths of human misery, joining himself to our frail nature. As if this act of humility were not enough, the hymn says that Jesus further humbled himself, accepting the status of a slave.

How do we share in Christ's glory? To share in Christ's glory, we must first walk on his road to glory. And that road is the road to Calvary, the road Jesus walked out of love for us sinners. Bloodied, exhausted, burdened with the heavy crossbeam, he walked that road, step by step. And these words, left unsaid, give sense to each painful step, "I do this for you, sinners, for I love you."

How do we respond to such a profound kind of love? Are we as unpredictable as the crowd, waving today joyfully our palms but going back tomorrow to our sinful lives?

FROM THE DIOCESE

LENTEN REGULATIONS


As we enter the Lenten Season, we offer a little refresher on what the Catholic Church in the United State requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- 1. The days of FAST (only one full meal) <u>and ABSTINENCE</u> (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. *St. Patrick's Day, March 17, falls on a Saturday this year.*
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, February 17-18 to Trinity Sunday, May 26-27.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.
