

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up you must fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year in advance before the anticipated wedding date.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes or the welcome envelopes located in the narthex); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Happy Mother's Day to all our mothers, grandmothers, step-mothers and others who offer motherly support in a loving way. An overworked mother wrote into a newspaper that the quickest way for a mother to get to her children's attention is to sit down and look comfortable. Let me share my own personal experience of my own mother. My siblings have the audacity to agree with what I have just said, as she is a workaholic and we never see her stop doing something except when she goes to sleep. I read a proverb that says, "God could not be everywhere, and therefore he created mothers." To honor and show our gratitude to the mothers this Mother's Day we are going to bless them in all the Masses this weekend. Thank you, so very much dear mothers. We love you!

Our experience in life's longing and happiness are quite usual and ordinary. Sometimes we had to journey into the past to make sense of the pain of the present. At times the insight did not abolish the pain, but at least the source of the pain was located and identified. And for me that is one of the uses of the past, to draw aside the veil that covers the present tense.

One of the ways we try to make sense of the present is by consulting the past. When we try to figure out why things have turned out the way they have, we often search the past for an understanding. Hence, ancient voices are listened to with a new attentiveness, old texts are consulted with a new eye, past events are scrutinized anew. That human effort of making sense of the present by rereading the past is one that was used widely in the Early Church, thus things are seen to happen "so that Scriptures might be fulfilled." Hence, in today's first reading we hear Peter saying: "Brothers, the passage of Scripture had to be fulfilled in which the Holy Spirit, speaking through David, foretells the fate of Judas, who offered himself as a guide to the men who arrested Jesus. To quote the Book of Psalms it says: "Let someone else take his office." Peter is claiming the past as a reinforcement of the present. A past, as we know, once skimmed over, now become part of the Church's sequence of references; what was said before becomes personal territory. The past takes on a new significance because of what is happening now. As the past throws light on the present, so the present captures the full meaning of the past. In that sense, we know the past is not dead for it just bides its time until the truth can be discovered.

Interestingly, the activity of bringing the past up to date is one that we all engage in from time to time. We have to review the past in the light of a new experience, and in the process, we begin to see a shape to our story. Certain dates and people become more important, an encounter once regarded as forgettable is seen to be directly related to what is happening now. We begin to see how our previous history contains pointers to our present situation, how everything is connected. A certain pattern slowly emerges.

In today's first reading, you can see the attempts of the early Church to make sense of all the recent happenings. They scour the past for signs, indications, clues. But when they come to look to the future of the Church and choose a successor to Judas, their faith takes a riskier turn. They nominate candidates, pray together and then draw lots.

Their faith is an enterprise which needs the support of the past but also the willingness to take risks in the present. Notice that the past cannot provide solutions to all their needs. The time comes when the disciples must go through the door into the dark, without being sure if the future will confirm their choice to be the right one. Our venture in faith, like theirs, needs the support of the past. We must take the risk. Amen.






