

SACRAMENT INFORMATION

Sacrament of Baptism is celebrated on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 P.M. or during the 11:30 A.M. Mass. Arrangements for all Baptisms must be made in advance by contacting the parish office at 732-938-5375. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism**Preparation Class is mandatory for parents. Godparents/ sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Classes are held in Classroom 10 at 7:30 P.M. on the last Monday of each month. To sign up you must fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend.

Sacrament of Marriage: Contact the parish office to begin marriage preparation at least one year in advance before the anticipated wedding date.

The Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is available as needed, by calling the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7

Recommendation for Sponsorship: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (showing attendance through the use of your church envelopes or the welcome envelopes located in the narthex); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we are so glad and so happy to see our very own 2nd Grade Students of the Parish Religious Education Program as they are receiving Jesus in the Holy Eucharist for the first time in their lives. We congratulate the communicants, their parents and teachers who have done a great job in preparing them for the reception of the Sacrament. Kudos to our catechists who have put plenty of time, effort and talents to make this First Communion significant and meaningful to the Parish Community. Thank you so very much.

Today is the Sixth Sunday of Easter.

It is not that easy to find how many lives have been transformed by the action of the Holy Spirit, but incredible things have happened in the lives of many people through the centuries, starting with the disciples of Jesus at Pentecost. Let us have an example like St. Francis of Assisi and St. Ignatius of Loyola. As we know both were wealthy young men who dreamed of glory in the field of battle. Instead the Holy Spirit was able to help them to discover their true divine calling in the service of Christ, to rebuild and renew the church. Their lives had been formed by the social expectations of their times to find happiness through the things that their money could buy. True enough, God had other ideas for them.

How about the life of Mother Teresa, now St. Teresa of Calcutta, who had another experience? She thought that she could do God's will as a teaching sister of Loreto until she experienced the poor people dying on the streets of the city outside the safe confines of the convent walls. Once again, God had other plans for her as she left the security of her religious house to establish the Missionaries of Charity, devoted to the poorest of the poor.

The disciples, too, were on the learning curve. Their expectations as followers of Jesus kept on changing. They were so inspired by the glory of Jesus, the popular and eloquent preacher and miracle worker. Through the despair of the passion and death of their master, they found themselves driven by the power of the Holy Spirit to proclaim the Good News to the whole world. But they had no plan, no instruction manual whatsoever. They discovered that they were sent not just to announce the coming of the Messiah to the Jews. The message of the Gospel was for everyone.

The beloved disciple, John, reflected for years on the life and teaching of Jesus and summed it up in his Gospel and letters. God is love and what God wants is for us to live in love just as Jesus has shown us, by loving one another. In this way we will share in the joy of God. The whole message of Scripture is to be found here: "love one another as I have loved you, remain in my love." The hope is expressed that we can come to appreciate God's choice of us. It is such good news that John is anxious to get the message within us, simply and clearly. Can we remain in the love that chooses us?

In these days after Easter, we relive with the disciples their growing awareness of how the risen Lord continued to be with them. How he shared his Holy Spirit with them to help them to understand all that Jesus had taught them. We discover with them that Jesus calls us in our turn to be his friends and to know his love for us. He wants us to continue his mission by bringing his love and peace to the people of our own day. We are ordinary people, struggling with our own lives, our fears, our weaknesses, but we believe. We believe that Jesus is risen from the dead. We believe that he uses us to bring his mercy and love to the world. Amen.




