

## OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

We are happy to welcome Sister Alice Vandenoever, a Maryknoll Sister, who will be making the Mission Appeal in our parish community this weekend. She taught Science and Mathematics both in secondary and college levels and has 22 years of mission experience in the Philippines, coordinating livelihood program in the squatter areas and board membership in Non-Governmental Organizations in urban squatter and relocation communities.

The Maryknoll Sisters are now in twenty-one countries throughout the world with their Mission being to make God's Love Visible. Their Ministries are in Agriculture, Advocacy, Catechetics, Counseling, Education, Healthcare, Human Rights, Nutrition Programs, Micro-Economics, Peace-Building, Prison Ministry, Refugee Outreach, Skills-Building, and Social Work. The people they serve are mainly the poor and vulnerable.

Please take time to listen to Sister Alice and prayerfully consider making a generous monetary offering in support of their Mission. Pray to the Lord for the success of their Mission as they intend to make a difference in helping the poor and needy. We thank you immensely for your generosity.

Today is the Eighteenth Sunday of the Year.

As Jesus was on His way to Jerusalem, many people gathered around Him to hear His teaching. A voice came from out of the crowd asking Jesus to make a judgment in the case of two brothers fighting over an inheritance. The question that came about had nothing to do with what Jesus had been teaching. The brother who felt as if he was cheated must have been listening to what Jesus was teaching. However, the interruption gave Jesus an excellent opportunity to speak on another topic, that is, greed.

Greed is an excessive desire for wealth or possessions. Everybody needs things, of course. We need clothes to wear, food to nourish us, a roof for shelter, etc., but things can quickly become a major obsession. It is not just the wealthy who can let greed and envy take control of their lives. It can also be a personality trait on anyone, whether they are poor, middle class, or wealthy. And so, when it does, then our possessions will end up owning us. Let us ask ourselves about our most fundamental underlying motives for our decisions, behaviors, and others. Is it to serve others or to get ahead in life? If we approach whatever we do with the attitude of service to others, we will be rich beyond our imagination. If we approach our actions with the opinion of, "bigger is better, status is important, success at the expense of others is part of the cost of doing business," then we are headed toward spiritual poverty, which can eventually result in miserable and unfortunate consequences.

Our God has given us important faculties like our brain; He gives us talents, He gives us energy, strength and time, as He expects us to use those beautiful gifts to provide for ourselves and our loved ones. To have to work and to be able to enjoy the fruits of our labor is not a punishment for sin. God put Adam and Eve in the Garden of Eden and commanded them to cultivate it and care for it before they committed the sin of disobedience.

As a conclusion to this reflection, allow me to share with you a true story that I heard. An American tourist was traveling and spending his holiday in Europe. He visited a wise and famous rabbi who lived there. The rabbi resided in a single room with a table and a chair and a good number of books. "Rabbi, where is all your furniture?" inquired the tourist. "Well, where is all yours?" the rabbi asked. The American tourist answered, "My furniture? I'm just passing through here." The wise rabbi responded: "That's also true for me. Although I've lived here my entire life, I'm aware that I'm simply passing through here too!"







## SACRAMENTAL AND FAITH FORMATION

**ANOINTING OF THE SICK:** To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

**BAPTISM:** We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.

**HOMEBOUND:** If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

**MATRIMONY:** Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

**RCIA:** The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

**SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN:** The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the **1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May**. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

**OBTAIN A MASS CARD:** We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

**PRAYER LIST:** Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

**MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA:** We welcome all on Mondays after the 9 am Mass in our Chapel.

**LOW GLUTEN HOST:** An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.
