### OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

#### FOURTH SUNDAY of ADVENT

Deciding who we can trust has profound consequences on our lives. Everyone, and maybe each generation, face the same question that Ahaz and Joseph faced; whom do I trust? On what foundations do I build my life? The fundamental promise that God makes to Ahaz, to Joseph and to us, is: "I am with you." The choice each of us then must make is; do I trust God? Do I live my life based on the belief that through the challenges and difficulties of life, God is with me, and with us as a community? As we face our own threats and challenges in life, both as individuals and as a Church, we can, like Azah, choose to place our trust in the false gods of our own time: materialism such as money and possessions, or power such as using people for our own ends, putting popularity, status and success before principle and truth. Or, like Joseph, we can listen to the still, quiet voice of the God who speaks to our better self in the silence of our dreams and our hopes, the God who quietly yet persistently invites us to live our lives in faith and confidence, rather than insecurity and fear. To genuinely trust God, to believe that God is with us – has the most profound consequence for our lives and for the community. Amen.

#### CHRISTMAS Reflections and Insights: In Deep Shadow, A Light Has Shone

High in the Andes, an Indian Prince is anointed in the darkness. Then, on a large raft in the center of a sacred lake, his naked body is plastered with gold dust by members of his tribe. They turn away so that they do not look at his face. They all wait in silence. Then the sun comes over the horizon and bathes in its light the Indian prince, gold in glory. He plunges into the lake, and the people cast jewels and sacred objects of gold into the water to sanctify the place where he swims. He is the legendary Eldorado, the gilded one. This ceremony is an annual ritual to the god of the sun for the people depending on its power.

For most primitive people throughout history, the sun was the supreme god, surveying the world, giving it light and warmth. And in the winter, these primitive people would light fires in the hope that they could strengthen the failing power of the sun. By the 4th century, the sun-god was proclaimed the principal patron of the Roman Empire, and December 25th was the date celebrated as the birthday of the invincible sun. This was the date of the winter solstice. On this day, the sun began its return to the northern skies, and bonfires were lit to welcome back the sun after the darkness of the short days.

The Feast of Christmas originated when the cult of the sun was particularly strong in Rome. The pagan festival was baptized by the Church in Rome, which used the same date to celebrate the birth of Christ. We do not know the date of Jesus' birth, but we do know why December 25th was chosen as the date to celebrate His birth. For us, the Yule logs and candles symbolize the warmth and light of another sun: the Son of God. In the darkness of this night, we celebrate the birth of the light of the world.

Ancient religions, as well as modern, always used the themes of light and darkness as a way of speaking about religious experience. Light has always been associated with goodness, knowledge, and hope. Darkness has symbolized evil, ignorance, and despair. In the 1st reading, we heard the prophet Isaiah voice his hope to the people of Judah:

The people that walked in darkness; Have seen a great light; On those who live in the land of deep shadow, a light has shone.

In our Christian tradition, we interpret that light to be Jesus Christ, "the true light that enlightens all men" (Jn.1:9). Without him, we are stumbling around in the dark; without him, we can come to prefer the dark to the light. He is the only light that darkness cannot overpower.

Christmas is a beautiful celebration of our faith in Jesus. We gather to celebrate light amid the darkness. We celebrate the new hope that Jesus has generated in people through the centuries. He is our light; he is our hope. When we want to know God, it is to Jesus that we turn; when we want to worship God, it is through Jesus that we sing our praises. We, too, give glory in the highest for revealing himself to the lowly.

The mystery of God was concentrated in a child. The hope of God's love was fastened on to this little one. God was choosing to visit his people, not through dreams and words of the prophets, but in human flesh. The God who lived in the highest heavens wanted another address; he decided to pitch his tent among us.

The Christmas story we hear each year is the same, but we are different. Our world is different. Our memories have grown, our hopes have been tested, our love has been called on in a new way. No matter what changes we have undergone, what losses we have mourned, the Christmas story speaks to us again of the new birth and the possibility of our own rebirth. It tells us that things can be different. It gives substance to our hope that new life is possible because of the birth of the Son of God. Amen.

May Christ's Peace and Hope be with you.
