



CELEBRATE, CALLED TO SERVE

For many weeks now, we have been celebrating the appearance of the divine presence in human form. As a child, he came to Mary and Joseph, was seen by the shepherds, and then by some wandering magi from the East. First Reading -- Isaiah speaks of the Servant whom the Lord upholds; he shall bring forth justice to the nations (*Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7*) or *Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11*.

Second Reading -- Jesus was anointed by God with the Holy Spirit; he went out healing and doing good (*Acts 10:34-38*) or *Titus 2:11-14; 3:4-7*.

Gospel -- A voice comes from heaven proclaiming Jesus as the beloved Son, with whom God is well pleased (*Luke 3:15-16, 21-22*).

PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the FEAST OF THE BAPTISM OF THE LORD JESUS.

Last Sunday, we celebrated the Feast of the Epiphany of Jesus. Epiphany means manifestation, the infant Jesus was manifested as the Savior not only of the Jews but of all mankind. Today, the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, is also an epiphany, a feast of a still further manifestation of our Lord.

Today, the Church asks us to leave aside the sweet, touching scene of the crib. We must see Jesus not as a tiny, helpless infant, but as a grown man who takes upon himself a tremendous burden and responsibility. The difficulty is the weight of the sins of all mankind. The trust is to make reparations for those sins.

Jesus took sin upon himself to do away with its guilt. As St. John the Baptist proclaimed, "Behold the lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world." His baptism was self-abasement, a humiliation. But from the waters of the Jordan, he emerged as a glorified Savior.


"You are my beloved son. On you, my favor rests." They evoke most clearly the Suffering Servant passages of the Old Testament. As we read from the first reading from Isaiah, "Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one with whom I am well pleased..." In its fullest sense, the idea of the servant found its realization in Jesus, and it was Jesus himself who identified himself as the servant of God. As such, Jesus would suffer for the sins of the people, all the people.

Our Christian life began with our baptism. It too was self-abasement, a humiliation. But we emerged from the waters of baptism as a new people with a new life. Our baptism was an end and a beginning. It was the end of the presence of sin and the beginning of the new life of God's favor. It was a sharing in the very death and resurrection of Jesus.

Every time we as baptized people celebrate the Holy Mass, we identify ourselves with Jesus, as he renews his sacrificial death on the Cross. We implicitly say that we too wish to be suffering servants of God, that we want to accept any suffering that is necessary to disassociate ourselves from sin. Each one of us has had the experience of knowing that self-denial and suffering are frequently involved in avoiding sin. Even more importantly, the attempt positively to lead a good, Christ-like life means self-sacrifice and generosity. In the Holy Eucharist, we not only identify ourselves with the suffering and generosity of Christ, but we also see the supreme model and example of what our lives should be: a total gift of ourselves to God in obedience and love. Amen.

SACRAMENT & FAITH FORMATION

ANointing of the Sick: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the **1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May**. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

OBTAin A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, according to Canon Law, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (*showing attendance through the use of your Church Envelopes, the Welcome Envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare Online Giving*); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.




