



PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of the Year.

Perhaps it is proper and fitting to reflect on the central theme of the readings this Sunday, and that is the "idea of change." As you can see and hear, Jesus' life was all about change. He came to change the world to teach us how to do an excellent job of loving God and loving one another. He turned the people who were sick and made them well. He changed sinners by forgiving them and telling them to live useful lives and ask them to sin no more. He turned people who were possessed by the evil spirit and set them free from the demons that controlled them. In his first miracle, which we have heard today in the Gospel, he changed water into wine and turned what would have been a failed celebration into a festive party.

Jesus continues and doesn't stop to call us to change. In his public ministry when he began to preach, he invited people to improve their lives, to get their hierarchy of values straight, and to put God first. Jesus continues to work miracles of change in the special meal he gave us the night before he died. He took bread and turned it into his body and changed wine into his blood.

This changed bread and wine that becomes Jesus' body and blood will change us. We will become more like him and grow closer to him. Our faith should not be static; it should be dynamic instead because the power of Jesus is at work.

Another interesting thought that came to me was the wine. One of those days when I was shopping for wine, I was struck by the sheer volume and varieties of wine: Red, White, Merlot, Californian, Argentinian, Chardonnay, and also alcohol-free. Not all of them are of the same quality, but all are wine. The first sign Jesus performs in John's Gospel is changing water into wine. Hesitant at first, he not only performs the sign, but he also creates the best wine of the wedding feast.

Have you thought of yourself as a fine wine? By water and the Holy Spirit, we are members of the Church. We have different gifts but the same spirit. We are one in Christ but diverse in gifts. All gifts, great or small, are needed in the Church. They complement one another, like the parts of a body. They are signs that God cares for each of us and our world. Having drunk of the same Spirit, we become good wine for a thirsty world. For St. Paul, whether we are a vintage sparkling wine or a newly-pressed varietal, God rejoices in each of us when we live the life of the Spirit given to us. Take time. Drink in the wine of God's Spirit given to you. Let Christ continue to ferment you, so your diverse gift becomes a fine wine that benefits one and all. Offer yourself during the Ordinary Time as an extraordinarily fine wine that gives glory to God. Amen.

Please include your full name(s), address, and envelope number. Please do not wait until the last minute since email requests are done once a week in February.

On-line Giving: If you contribute online, the statement is provided by WeShare, not St. Catherine of Siena Parish. Statements will be mailed by the end of January, (provided they have your correct email address). If you do not receive your email by early February, please contact the Parish Office at frontoffice@sienachurch.org. *Note: Online giving users can print your Giving History for 2018, but it is not an official tax document.*

SACRAMENT & FAITH FORMATION

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor letters, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is mandatory for parents. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. For more information, please call the Parish Office.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SACRAMENTS FOR CHILDREN: The RCIA for children is a process that invites any child age 7 to 18, interested in the Catholic Faith, to discover what the Catholic Church teaches and believes. It is open to anyone seeking to get to know Jesus. Like the RCIA for adults, this process is accomplished in a comfortable, friendly and informal environment designed for children. Certain Rites are celebrated in the church throughout their journey in faith. Near the end of the process, the Sacraments of Initiation—Baptism, Confirmation and Eucharist—are celebrated at the Easter Vigil. The RCIA for Children will be offered on the **1st, 2nd and 3rd Sunday of the Month October thru May**. Please contact the Parish Office for more information.

OBTAIN A CERTIFICATE OF ELIGIBILITY: In order to be a godparent/sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, according to Canon Law, a person must have received all their Sacraments through Confirmation; be at least 16 years of age; if married, be married in the Catholic Church; attend Mass faithfully (*showing attendance through the use of your Church Envelopes, the Welcome Envelopes located in the narthex, or via WeShare Online Giving*); be a registered, actively participating parishioner for a minimum of six (6) months. Please stop by the Parish Office to fill out a form to be recommended for sponsorship. All requests will be seen by the Pastor and you will be notified when your form is ready.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.


