## OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

Words are not enough to express our sincerest thanks and appreciation to all the fathers. Therefore, we are going to have the blessing for all the fathers at each Mass this weekend. Kudos to our fathers, we are immensely thankful to you.

One of the many vital roles of the Pastor, aside from the administration of the Sacraments, is to build up the Kingdom of Jesus in his community. As part of our responsibilities, caring for the elderly, the sick, etc., we are glad to partner with Caregiver Volunteers of Central Jersey. Let us be mindful and participate in helping them. We invite you to listen to their representative this weekend on all the Masses. Please support them in any generous way we can. Thanks so much.

Today the Church celebrates the Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity. Life has so many mysteries. As we know, science tries to solve many of them and it is interesting that as we come to understand some mysteries, we discover even more of them. At times we don't understand people we live with. Sometimes we don't even understand ourselves. Yet there are those who think they should follow the one who created all this mystery and that God should not be mysterious at all. There is so much more in life and about God that we must learn and understand. Jesus told us in today's Gospel when he said, "I have much more to tell you, but you cannot handle it now." He would send the 'Spirit of truth' to guide us.

Like all mysteries in the universe, the mystery of God is something we keep understanding with greater clarity, and yet we know there is much more we must learn. On Trinity Sunday, we celebrate our common divine origin, that we are children of God with one shared life in the Holy Spirit. All the readings highlight God's presence in the world from its beginning. The Trinity holds all things together. The parts are all aspects of the same God, God as the maker of all things, God before us and over us; God incarnates as Jesus Christ, fully human, fully divine, God beside us. Moreover, the mutual love and wisdom that is God the Holy Spirit breathed into our very lives and all creation. In the Trinity, there is no hierarchy, only mutual love and harmony.

One ancient shape used to bring to my attention the nature of God is three intertwined circles of trefoil. A circle has no beginning and no end; its never-ending form represents God as eternal. This trefoil symbol was used by St. Patrick when he illustrated the Trinity by pointing to a shamrock and remarking that it had three separate leaves yet formed one shamrock. The three persons of the Trinity are also presented as being engaged in a happy dance; we can try to step in with the divine dance and appreciate the constant presence of Jesus in our lives with the natural world through the Holy Spirit. We pray during our Eucharist to be filled with the Holy Spirit so that we may become one body and spirit. The Holy Spirit connects us all to each other and the natural world.

So as we celebrate this doctrine of our faith, let us give thanks for the mystery of our redemption by God, through Christ in the power of the Holy Spirit. Let us give thanks for this divine outpouring of a pure gift for our sake. Also, may we respond by glorifying God by living in a right relationship with him and with one another. Amen.

**New Jersey Independent Victims Compensation Program opens June 15**

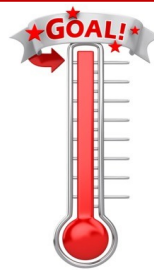
As had been announced in February of this year, the Diocese of Trenton – along with the other Roman Catholic dioceses in New Jersey – has established an Independent Victim Compensation Program (IVCP) to compensate those who, as minors, were sexually abused by a priest or deacon of the Diocese. The IVCP will be open to claims beginning June 15.

The IVCP is independently administered by experienced victim compensation experts Kenneth R. Feinberg and Camille S. Biros. Mr. Feinberg was the plan administrator for the federal 9/11 victim compensation program, as well as the Boston Marathon bombing compensation program.

The IVCP will handle the submission, evaluation and resolution of individual claims, and will operate independently of the Diocese or any Church-affiliated institution. The administrators of the IVCP will have complete autonomy to determine the eligibility of a claim with the guidelines of the established Protocol. The amount of compensation for those who make a claim will be determined by the IVCP administrators. All victims – no matter when the abuse occurred – are eligible to participate, and all matters will be handled confidentially. Victims of clergy sexual abuse of a minor can begin the process of utilizing the program by going to [www.njdiocesesisivcp.com](http://www.njdiocesesisivcp.com) and reviewing the Protocol for submitting a claim. Anyone who was sexually victimized as a minor by a priest or deacon of the Diocese is strongly encouraged to participate in the IVCP. The Diocese also asks that anyone who knows of someone who was abused to pass along this information to the victim so that he or she is aware of the IVCP.

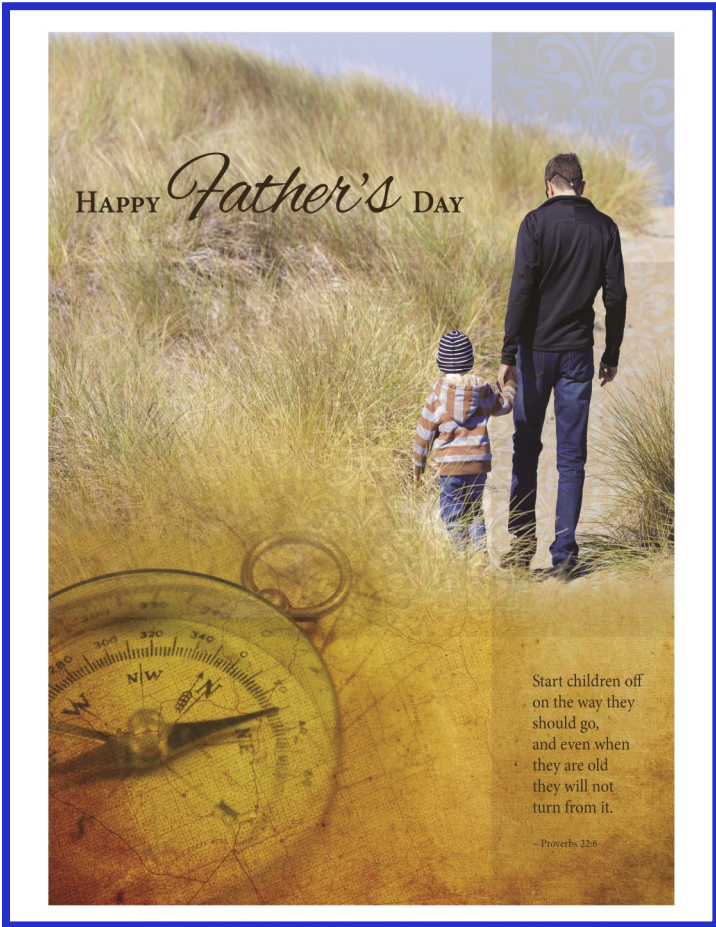
