

### OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ

The feast of the Body and Blood of Christ proclaims clearly to all of us Jesus' followers that the real way to heaven is through nourishment from Jesus Christ, our Lord and Savior. This undeniable fact and truth begin at a child's First Communion, continuing as often as the child takes Eucharist throughout his/her journey, concluding with his/her final journey.

Please allow me to share with you this true story. One of the most remarkable contemporary witnesses to the power of the Eucharist is Cardinal Nguyen Van Thuan. He was born in 1928 in Vietnam. In 1975, at the age of 47, Pope St. Paul VI named him the Coadjutor Archbishop of Saigon in Vietnam. During the war, he was arrested by communist forces. He was subsequently sent to prison where he remained for 13 years until his release in 1988. He was then expelled from Vietnam.

The cardinal, who died in 2002, wrote movingly of celebrating Mass secretly in his prison cell. Deprived of his possessions, he wrote to friends asking for some medicine for his stomach. This was a codeword for the wine that he needed to celebrate the Mass. He also received some hosts, smuggled into the camp along with the wine: "I will never be able to express my great joy. Every day, with three drops of wine and a drop of water in the palm of my hand, I would celebrate the Mass. This was my altar, and this was my cathedral. It was true medicine for soul and body, medicine of immortality, remedy so as not to die but to have always life in Jesus." As St. Ignatius of Antioch says, "In the Mass, he united himself with the cross of Jesus, drank the bitter chalice of suffering and renewed the eternal offering of his life to Christ." Increasingly, his heart beat with the life of Jesus as he united his life with him. He wrote, "The Eucharist became for me and the other Christians a hidden and encouraging presence amid all our difficulties. Jesus was adored secretly by the Christians who lived with me, just as happened so often in the prison camps of the 20th century." St. Teresa of Avila says, "Jesus became his true companion in the Most Holy Sacrament."

The celebration of this feast is an excellent opportunity to ask how does God bless you? How do you praise God? To bless is to thank God for someone or something and to ask God's protection of what is blessed. Jesus blesses God for the five loaves and two fish the 12 Apostles provide. God's protection is experienced in more than enough food for the crowd. In our 2nd reading, the earliest scriptural source of celebrating the Eucharist, Jesus takes bread and wine, gives thanks for them, shares them, and says, "Do this in remembrance of me." By doing this as he did, we renew the covenant with God through Jesus, Jesus is present in our midst, and he offers us as God's blessing.

Let us reflect on the gifts God has given us. Thank God for them. Use them to feed others with the presence of Christ, in remembrance of him. That is one way to Christ, and to proclaim the death of the Lord with the food of our lives.
