

OUR PASTOR'S MESSAGE

Dear Parishioners,

During November, our Diocese will implement a promotion initiative entitled, "CALLED BY NAME," a program that invites men, 16 years of age or older, to consider a vocation as a priest. Central to this program is the belief that all of us share a common calling through baptism, to which we are invited to respond in different ways to marriage, consecrated life, single life, and ordained ministry. This process focuses on priesthood and emphasizes the vital role of the Christian community in calling forth men to consider this vocation.

Every parishioner throughout the Diocese is encouraged to consider who in our midst might serve well as a priest and submit their names during weekend liturgies. You never know, there are many potential priests who are waiting to be asked. We can list a few of the qualities of persons identified as prospective candidates:

1. A person of prayer who loves the Lord Jesus
2. A person who is actively involved in the life of the Church
3. A person who is successful in life, including school, work, and relationships
4. A "people person"
5. A person with personal integrity, honesty, and generosity

We are providing more information about this program at this weekend Masses. Please keep in mind, it is imperative that we actively support and promote a future generation of priests to serve a growing Church.

Today is the THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY of the YEAR

When we read about people who have heroic stories as they've given up their lives to serve others, we are touched and humbled. Some may not be necessarily religiously motivated, but they have deep compassion for the suffering of their fellow human beings. How they proclaimed the testimonies of such lives could be contagious. It touches something deep within us, and we are propelled to act and do something more than merely dipping into our pocket for a bit of spare change.

The man in our Gospel today, Zacchaeus, was a senior tax collector. Often tax collectors were despised in their communities. In the first place, they were collaborating with the occupying forces of Rome. They made their living by collecting taxes from the local people to support the oppressive structure of imperial Rome. But more than that, they made themselves rich by adding a premium to what they had to deliver to the Romans to cover their extravagant lifestyle. Zacchaeus was not happy with his way of life. He saw something in Jesus that was different. He wanted to know what it was. So he climbed a sycamore tree that was along the way Jesus would pass so that he could get a view and hoping to learn his secret.

He got more than he was looking for. Jesus not only saw him in the tree but called him down. Jesus did not join in the universal condemnation of tax collectors, but on the contrary, went so far as to invite himself to the home of Zacchaeus. The crowd complained about Jesus associating with such a man. The reaction of Zacchaeus was different. The way Jesus accepted him. Not condemning or criticizing helped Zacchaeus to see that he could change his life and do things differently. At this time, he was ready to give back his ill-gotten wealth and start anew.

The vital point of the Gospel is to show us that the answer to our inner longings is not to acquire more things for ourselves, but rather to build relationships of love and compassion with others who are on the same journey, with Jesus as our leader and guide. He brought salvation to Zacchaeus and his house. He did not condemn what he had been doing or even ask him to change. Only by inviting himself into his home, Jesus helped Zacchaeus make new and better choices for his life.

What about us today? Jesus offers us new choices. Will you try to find fulfillment in the enjoyment of what this world has to offer in power, pleasure, and possessions? When have you experienced the mercy that Jesus showed Zacchaeus?





SACRAMENTAL AND FAITH FORMATION

ANointing of the Sick: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.**

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** Please stop by the Parish Office to request a sponsor certificate. All certificates are approved by the Pastor.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

MIRACULOUS MEDAL NOVENA: We welcome all on Mondays after the 9 am Mass in our Chapel.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.
