


FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Due to the COVID 19 pandemic, many changes that have happened, and the regular schedule of our Religious Education Program is no exception. This weekend, August 15-16, we joyfully begin the First Communion of our 2nd grade children at the 4:30 PM Vigil Mass, the 10:00 AM and 11:30 AM Sunday Liturgy. During this present crisis, we are blessed and fortunate to celebrate the First Communion of our young students as they receive Jesus, His Most Precious Body offered at the Mass. Let us keep in mind that we are to follow the directives and proper protocols given to us to be safe and avoid the spread of the virus. It is our responsibility as a Church, the parents, the teachers, and all of us who, in one way or another, contributed in preparing these young children for the reception of the sacrament to teach continuously, form, and guide them. As a parish family, we ask for your fervent prayers for these young children as they continue their faith journey. Our congratulations to the first communicants and their beloved parents-guardians. A warm thanks to our most gracious volunteer catechists and aides, as this event would not be possible without their helping hand. Thank you so much.

Feast of the Assumption of Mary

In the Assumption, Mary is fully united with her Son in glory. She remains his Mother. He remains her Son. As Jesus said in the Gospel, Mary is our Mother, for, on Calvary, Jesus gave her to us to be our Mother. "Woman, behold your son," he said to her and St. John, a representative of all the disciples. Jesus said, "Behold your mother." We know and believe that Mary is so much concerned about our salvation. We understand and expect that Mary will help us, and we pray for her intercession. Jesus is our savior, and we all believe that. If we can ask others to pray for us and we pray for them, why can't those in heaven pray for us, and we likewise pray for them? Are we now separated from those who have died so that they can no longer help us? If we seek the prayers of the sinners on earth, for we are all sinners, why not ask the saints' intercession in heaven? Why not turn to the Queen of saints, God's Mother? The Assumption of Mary tells us that God is not only concerned about our souls but also our bodies. They are temples of the Holy Spirit. They are part of who we are, and so the Feast of the Assumption is a feast that celebrates who we are going to be in the near future.

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time

After reading this Gospel carefully, it could reasonably be asked, "Why to put such a story into the Gospel in the first place?" When Matthew was writing his account, the followers of Jesus were still arguing with what might call the terms and conditions for entry into the community of believers. Who could be in, and who to exclude? In answering this question, Matthew shows that in withdrawing to the region of Tyre and Sidon, Jesus deliberately puts himself in foreign territory to demonstrate what inclusion means. He deftly sets the scene for his encounter with the excluded woman. It is there Matthew answers the question about inclusion and exclusion, reminding the Church what Jesus did for people who were excluded and regarded as outsiders, and so teaching that his followers, both then and now, should do the same.


In our lives, we expect certain people to be our guides and to teach and inspire us, and so we can sometimes miss the unexpected grace and inspiration from encounters with those we might otherwise choose to ignore. Even the screaming child in the grocery store or supermarket might provide an opportunity to treasure the frantic parent with a sympathetic few words, "Don't worry; we've all been there." The distraught parent might welcome this as the only meaningful encounter with an adult she or he has had all day.

When we gather as people of faith, how do we acknowledge strangers in the community? Do we prefer to ignore them when they nervously join us for conversation in the parish hall afterward? We understand that during this pandemic, we have to follow the protocols of social distancing, etc. But what about before and after we have gone through with this crisis? Is it too much trouble for us to take the time to talk to them because we would instead share our company with those we number as close friends? Do we give them the scraps from our table of hospitality when we could perhaps provide a little more of ourselves? We may never know that even a brief encounter can have on the lives of others. Amen.




Inspiration for the week






