

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As a parish community of St. Catherine, we are pleased to inform you of the blessed First Communion ceremony held during our weekend liturgies. We credit the parents, the catechists, and the First Communicants for having completed their coursework, as they are well-prepared to receive Jesus with due respect and reverence. In the middle of these challenging times, we shared directives from the Diocese, and we are happy to see that the parents and the communion candidates adhere to our guidelines. Congratulations, and thank you so much for your cooperation and understanding.

As we all know, communications are so valuable, most especially if we receive them in a timely fashion. After careful study and discernment, we, the leadership of Religious Education, decided that during these challenging times and with so much uncertainty, our classes for all levels on religious education are going VIRTUAL. We saw the strong need to protect the safety, well-being, and health of our young children and catechists and everyone else. And so we are appealing to all, most notably the parents, who are the first teachers of these children's faith, to volunteer as teachers, also our former catechists and aides, please, we need your help. Training will be provided as we respond to this plea. Thank you in advance as you consider being one of the volunteers in the program. Kindly check with our religious program coordinator for more detailed information.

Twenty First Sunday in Ordinary Time

A story comes to mind about a preacher who approached the pulpit and started delivering his homily on the subject "distraction at prayer." He shared about a lady he knew well. She got up during his reflection one Sunday and, with embarrassment, and quickly left the Church. The priest went on to say that this happened because she was distracted by something. Incidentally, he met the lady later on than week. She began to apologize, saying, "Oh, Father, I am so sorry that I had to leave the Church during your homily. I had the terrible thought that I had left the oven on, so I had to return home immediately." The priest concluded by saying, "And that, my friends in Christ, is a distraction at prayer." Sitting in the Church was little Angelica, age nine years old. She put her hand up, and when the priest saw this, he asked, "Do you have a question?" Angelica responded, with no embarrassment or hesitation, "Instead of being a distraction, could it had been God telling the woman to go home because the oven would catch fire, her house would burn down, and she and her children would have no place to stay?" Isn't it refreshing to hear from the mouth of babes and children? We always need to be open to new ways of looking at things and listening to voices then.

Often when we find ourselves being asked personal questions, sometimes we feel like we are being pushed into a corner with so little space for moving. Faith and religion are those areas where many of us can feel uncomfortable when directly asked about those matters. We think we have a right to our private stance, and hence no one should ever ask about our religious beliefs. And so we can thank God today for Peter's insight and for his fortitude to speak up.

The Gospel we heard today can empower and motivate us never to lose our courage and a sense of purpose in speaking about our faith. We are genuinely the present-day disciples of Jesus, as we have the same mandate as the first disciples, and if we do not act or speak up as faithful to Jesus, then who will?

I am happy to conclude this reflection in quoting G.K. Chesterton, who said, "If there were no God, there would be no atheists." It is quite unfortunate to say that we live in a world in which it's all too easy to feel embarrassed or hesitant to speak about our faith. As faithful followers of Jesus, we are called never to feel intimidated or nervous to announce the message of Jesus, because God knows how much it is needed today. Amen.






Inspiration for the week




