FROM THE DESK OF THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Merry Christmas! You might be surprised to know Christmas celebration is not just a one-day event. Rather it is so extremely great, and that is why on the calendar of the Church it takes weeks for us to celebrate for it is a season of jubilant celebration, the most wonderful time of the year for the savior of the world, has been born as foretold by the prophets.

On December 8, the Feast of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary, we have announced The Holy Father, Pope Francis, has declared the year ahead as the "Year of St. Joseph," In the Pope's apostolic letter entitled "Patris Corde" (With a Father's Heart), it marks the 150th anniversary of the declaration of St. Joseph as "Patron of the Universal Church" by Blessed Pope Pius IX. Pope Francis's purpose of this apostolic letter is to increase our love for this great saint, to encourage us to implore his intercession and to imitate his virtue and zeal. FEAST OF THE HOLY FAMILY OF JESUS, MARY, AND JOSEPH

A story was told about a little boy, about the age of 5 years old, who was left alone with his father at bedtime. This had never happened before. After some maneuverings and a lot of fun, the father finally got the little fellow into his nightclothes and was about to lift him into bed when the child said, "But Daddy, I have to say my prayers." He knelt beside the bed, joined his hands, raised his eyes to heaven, and prayed: "Now I lay me down to sleep. I pray the Lord, my soul, to keep; If I should die before I wake, I pray the Lord my soul to take." That was his usual prayer. But tonight, he looked up at his Dad, raised his eyes to heaven, and prayed, "Dear Lord, make me a great big, good man, like my Daddy. Amen." In a moment, he was in bed and, five minutes later, asleep. But the father knelt by his son's bedside and prayed, "Dear Lord, make me a great big, good man like my boy thinks I am."

Implanting man the urge and stimulus to find a family, God made man sharers in His creative love. This love must be creatively exercised at home. In building a happy home, man expands his capacity and fructifies his talent to love and be loved. We are all products of homes. In our homes, we experience love in varying degrees of intensity and depths.

In a happy home, we experience joy and peace. But our happiness, peace, and joy are not complete, and no wonder. The best homes can only be but an entranceway to heaven, where our happiness will be full. But we can make our home vestibules to heaven. It is the duty of every family member. Our first and foremost duty is to love, and love means to care. A home where members love and care for one another is a happy home.

Do we love and care for our family members? Children need their parents, not just what they can provide for them. The happiness of parents comes from decent, loving children. The crisis in a modern family is a crisis of values that flow from love. The Holy Family was poor in material things but rich in love that builds up personal relationships. A happy home cannot survive on the ruins of personal relationships.

Jesus was born into a family. He grew in wisdom and grace before God and man in the family. He was obedient to his parents; He was their source of joy and their crown of bliss. As simple, humble people, Jesus, Mary, and Joseph must have cherished mutual love, a feeling of oneness, respect for one another, and shared the responsibilities, joys, and sorrows of family life. Theirs was a holy family, and the Church presents it as an ideal family.

The Gospel presents the ideal picture of a family that reflects the Holy Trinity's inner life. The perfect love relationship manifested in the life of Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Jesus, the Prince of Peace, enlivened and enlightened them, filled the family with grace, harmony, and joy. And for this reason, St. Paul wishes us today: "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts.". Amen.



Continue to unite all people in peace and shed Your light of understanding and faith upon this World, as we cope with this pandemic.


With the Magi and the Shepherds, we bow before You with hearts full of wonder.

Amen.


