FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

SIXTH SUNDAY IN THE ORDINARY TIME

It is not difficult to know and understand that any new movement or community which emerges from an older tradition has to face the problems of its own identity and direction. How different is it from the old community? How similar? One of the difficulties which the Early Church had to face was its relationship with Judaism. Jesus was a Jew, and his early followers were all Jews. They upheld the Law of Moses, and they honored the traditions of their people. But there is also discontinuity with the tradition when it comes to healing on the Sabbath, attitudes towards Samaritans, and fasting.

Matthew himself is a Jewish convert living in Syria and writing his Gospel for a mixed community of Jewish and Gentile converts. He has to hold these groups together in the community, both the Jewish converts who respect the tradition of the Law of Moses and the convert Gentiles who have their own traditions.

When Matthew writes his Gospel, he is anxious to show that Jesus does not come to abolish the Law and the prophets; instead, he comes to complete it. Matthew shows the continuity with the ancient tradition. But he also shows the discontinuity when Jesus says, "You have heard how it was said...but I say this to you..." Jesus completes the Law, but he also goes beyond it. Because Jesus is who he is, he has the authority to put before people a new vision.

Jesus confirms the old Law in its condemnation of killing, but he goes much further in condemning the motivation that often leads to killing, like anger. He asks his disciples to take responsibility for the charges made against them. If their brother has something against them, they should leave their gift at the altar and attend to that complaint first. Reconciliation is more important than sacrifice. The duty to make peace is more urgent than the duty to offer worship to God. If people are not reconciled, then no amount of liturgy is going to disguise their brokenness.

Today's Gospel, from the Sermon on the Mount, Jesus brings us back to the basics of our faith; such as the love of God and the love of neighbor. Jesus says he is not contradicting the Jewish scriptures and the Ten Commandments, which give a framework of discipline and order. However, he is opposed to the legalistic type of religion the scribes and Pharisees have built upon them; full of petty rules which have little to do with God's Law. "If your virtue goes no deeper than that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never get into the kingdom of heaven," he says.

Jesus healed on the Sabbath, which was against the Law. He spoke to women in public, which was a taboo. Jesus says that the Pharisees have so defined the Law on their terms that they missed the point. And so, he expounded on the Law as it pertains to six subjects like murder, adultery, divorce, oath-taking, retaliation, and love for one's enemy. Instead of a litany of more commandments, Jesus looks to the spirit of the Law. The presence of God's life within us is the real reason the Law commands us not to kill others, and not to lie about them or steal from them. We are called to love, as God loves.

Being a Christian is more than following the rules and only attending liturgies. Jesus is setting us free to make choices that support, sustain, grow, and nurture life for ourselves and one another. We choose life when: we care for those who are poor, respect the dignity of every human being, and protect God's creation. We choose life when we are generous with our time, money, compassion and resources.

Would anyone looking at us and listening to us know that God is at the center of our lives? Jesus says we should love others and the world as God does. We are to be compassionate and passionate, not lukewarm. The Beatitudes call us to humility, simple living, and peace, which often opposes prevailing values in the world. Our human lives are capable of transformation when we reflect on God's glory and love in our daily lives. Amen.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.


