Dear Parishioners,

This weekend our Altar Rosary Society is hosting a Bake Sale in the Parish Hall. We, as a parish family, are encouraged to support this event for a beautiful cause. Why don't we stop by the Hall before and after Masses this weekend? Many thanks to our ministry for dedicating their precious time and invaluable efforts.

FIFTH SUNDAY IN THE ORDINARY TIME

I recently read a story about a preacher who went on and on with his sermon that I would like to share with you. A man got up and walked out of the Church. He came back near the end of the service. The Preacher made an effort to greet him as the congregation was leaving the Church and said, "Tim, I noticed you left during my sermon and then came back later. Are you feeling okay?" "Sure," Tim replied. "I'm alright. I just went out for a while to get a haircut." "Why didn't you do that before you came to Church?" the Preacher asked. Tim replied, "I didn't need it, then." I'll bet few ever got up to leave while Jesus was speaking. He even had to work a miracle to feed the large crowd of people because their day with Jesus lasted so long. The Gospel today is a continuation of Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.

Lighthouses are incredible structures and they come in many different sizes and shapes. They are often built-in or close to inhospitable places. There is something enigmatic about them. They are immovable objects in areas of danger, and they share one thing in common, that is, they unashamedly shine their light and save lives. Whether it's the Jersey Shore, the Red Sea, or the English Channel, lighthouses all have one job to do, which is to be an unfailing beacon and sign of hope to the traveler on the waves.

The Gospel for today speaks so well about the clarity in Jesus' teaching about the need for his witnesses to be bearers of light. Jesus calls us, his followers, to take pride, stand up, and be bold in sharing the new life that they find in him. To know Jesus is to be living in the light, and this light cannot be hidden. Those good works, which followers of Jesus would naturally want to engage in, will be a beacon for others.

Today's Gospel reading is preceded in Matthew by the Beatitudes. Jesus is teaching that we are all called to see ourselves in the way that God sees us. Jesus tells us those who, in the eyes of the world, live in the darkness are, in fact, those who are truly blessed. These are the ones who share in the sufferings of Christ. These are the ones who have the light. This light is to be shared, so all may find that safe harbor.

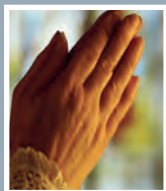
Keep in mind that just as lighthouses are all different in their appearance, so are we. We all possess unique talents and gifts. Thus, we all have a distinct way of interacting with each other and the world. As followers of Christ, what we share in common is the Gospel message. The central focus of God is love. We find freedom in Christ, who suffered, died, and rose from the dead for all of us. As we became baptized into Christ, and with the Holy Spirit in us, we are all called to share God's love as we grow in holiness according to our vocation. This vocation, be it marriage, single life, the religious life or the priesthood, is our way in which we share the light of the Gospel.

Life in the parish is so enriching. One of the most beautiful things we see are people who are fully alive and filled with the light of Christ and know how to worship. Our psalm for today tells us that God dwells in the praises of His people for when a great devotion and lively, heartfelt, worship exists, a powerful light is emitted. A place of worship can become a lighthouse, spreading grace into the local community. A family who prays regularly can become a transmitter of light to the neighborhood. Christians gathering to listen to, receive, and respond to the light of the world do so as gifted individuals. When we share that light through our works of charity, we are doing so collectively because we are indeed the body of Christ. Amen.

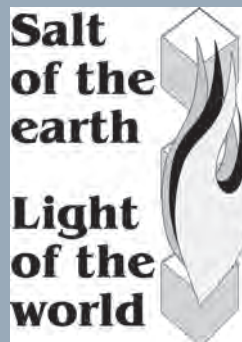

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up for the class, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.**

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.

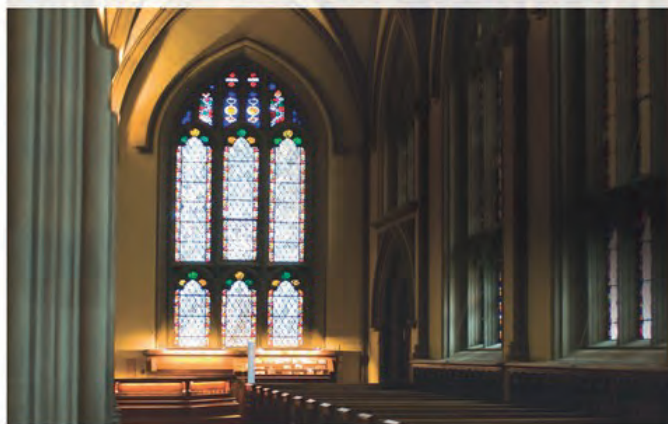

BISHOP ASKS FLOCK TO SHARE CHRIST WITH OTHERS THROUGH SUPPORT OF ANNUAL CATHOLIC APPEAL

Where would we be without an awareness of God in our lives?" That is the question that Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., asks in his video message for the 2020 Annual Catholic Appeal that is set to launch in all parishes Feb. 15 and 16. In introducing the Appeal, Bishop O'Connell reflected on its theme - a message taken from St. Augustine: "God gives where he finds empty hands." "As Christians, we are called to do the same," he said, and "this year's Annual Catholic Appeal is a new and impactful way you can share Christ with others." The video, which will be screened at all Masses on Appeal Weekend, will highlight the many ministries and programs supported by the campaign, which has a goal this year of \$7 million.
