FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the FEAST of The BAPTISM of JESUS.

It is interesting to see when people make a dramatic change in their lives; we're usually curious to discover the reason. What makes people change the direction of their lives? Is it a necessity? Are they just dissatisfied with their old way of life, or drawn to a new way of life? Why should someone give up the quiet security of village life and begin a way of life that will put him in a danger zone where secular and religious authority will unite against him? Why should Jesus leave the region of Galilee and head south on a three-day journey to see a prophet who lives in the wilderness?

In today's Gospel, we have Matthew's account of Jesus' baptism, the great event that stands between the hidden life of Nazareth and the public life of the traveling ministry. Matthew tells us that John heads south because he wants baptism from John. John's baptism was directed to his fellow Jews as a call to repentance to prepare the way for the promised one.

Matthew tells us that the purpose of Jesus' baptism is to fulfill God's saving plan. Jesus does not have to be baptized to be cleansed. Instead, his baptism, as seen in the Gospel, is the moment when God's plan became fulfilled in Jesus.

Jesus emerges of the water after his baptism, the heavens opened, the Spirit of God descends on him, and a voice from heaven recognizes him as "my Son, the Beloved." None of the evangelists suggests that any bystander notices these beautiful elements: nor is it expressed that the people marveled, were astonished, or gave praise to God, reactions typically noted when miraculous happenings occur. Matthew is bringing out the meaning of Jesus' baptism in these elements: he is showing how Jesus, the Son of God, is the fulfillment of the ancient plan of God. Part of that plan as expressed in the first reading from Isaiah:

"Here is my servant whom I uphold, my chosen one in whom my soul delights. I have endowed him with my spirit that he may bring justice to the nations."

St. Peter wrote in his Acts, that after being anointed by the Spirit, Jesus "went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil." After forty days in the desert, where the devil tempted him to abandon his mission, Jesus began to create the Church, "the way" they used to call it; his followers, like him, were committed to doing good. Over the centuries, some religious communities were formed in the Church to go about doing good in extraordinary selfless ways. All over the world, in the poorest and most desperate places, the followers of Jesus are still to be found, caring, teaching, and loving. Near home, they are, for example, street pastors, and Christians who are running food banks, hostels and soup kitchens for those who are homeless, caring for people who are sick or elderly, and for children with emotional and physical difficulties.

Yet our baptism is not so much a sign of our commitment to God and to "doing good," but of God's commitment to us. The Father's voice told Jesus, "This is my Son, the Beloved; my favor rests on him." At our baptism, God says the same to us. We become God's beloved sons and daughters, and God's favor rests on us. When Peter baptized the Roman centurion, Cornelius, he explained that "anybody of any nationality who fears God and does what is right is acceptable to him." And our Catholic churches are full of people of many nationalities.

It is often through caring for others that people discover the real meaning of life, and that faith itself can be found or strengthened. It is not necessarily an easy life, but one that sometimes involves hard choices and a growing commitment to keep going, however hard it gets a commitment sustained by God's grace-filled promise, "This is my Son, the Beloved: my favor rests on him."

We have to keep in mind that our baptism asks us not to run away from our Christian calling to do good; however hard, demanding, and wearing it may be. Once in a while, we have the concrete example of an elderly dependent requiring care that only a loving home can give, and this is not to abandon them. But if anyone does run away from their God-given responsibilities, they can find that life suddenly loses its meaning; it becomes empty and without purpose. Amen.



In this reading, Peter gives his first sermon to pagans. Asked by a Roman centurion to preach the Gospel to his household, Peter is initially astounded by the request, but after a dream, Peter preaches and baptizes the entire household.

Gospel: Matthew 3:13-17

After initially protesting his unworthiness, John baptizes Jesus. After the baptism, the Spirit of God descended upon Jesus and a voice said, "This is my beloved Son. My favor rests on him."

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month.** To sign up for the class, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office**.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.
