

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today is the Second Sunday of the year in the Church's calendar.

One of the most curious facts of modern life is the growing number of cults and sects, which competes for our attention alongside the significant religions. Perhaps that is not so curious when we appreciate the genuine longing of many people for something to believe in that is higher than the wage packet. When people speak of cults, they usually refer to a different religion or the excessive admiration of a person. Most factions are movements that have broken away from mainstream religion, which often arise from the supposed failure of those religions to address the personal needs of their followers. Because of this, cults usually stand as a critical challenge to institutional religion.

It is worth noting that when the Christian movement began, it was regarded in most places as a strange cult focusing on Jesus of Nazareth. One of the problems the early church had to face was another cult, the Baptist sect, who believed that John the Baptist, not Jesus, was the Messiah. The Baptist sect argued that their master was superior to Jesus for two main reasons. Firstly, John the Baptist was before Jesus, and that priority gave him superiority; secondly, Jesus submitted to John's baptism of repentance, making him inferior to John. Faced with these arguments, the early church had to respond and clarify its position regarding John the Baptist.

In today's Gospel, we see how the evangelist John faces these charges. John takes the point that priority does indeed mean superiority and shows that Jesus is superior to the Baptist because he pre-existed him. So, John the Baptist declares: "A man is coming after me who ranks before me because he existed before me." Jesus is the Word who existed from the beginning; all that came to be had life in him. As for Jesus submitting to the baptism of John, the fourth Gospel drops the account of Jesus' baptism; instead, John the Baptist interprets the meaning of the baptism by affirming that the Spirit of God rests on Jesus.

When the religious leaders sent messengers to John to find out who he is, he protests that he is not the Christ, not Elijah, and not the Prophet. John keeps declaring who he is not to say who Jesus is. All that he is not, Jesus is. The Baptist is wholly subordinate to Jesus. A truth declared in the prologue to the Gospel: "He was not the light, only a witness to speak for the light." (1:8)

The scripture scholars explain that John the Baptist had a group of faithful and fervent followers, even long after his death. They believed there was no one quite like him, that in fact, he was the Messiah whom so many were waiting for. When Jesus appeared on the scene, amazing people by his preaching and his miracles, impressing them deeply by his gentleness and concern for the outcast, there were still followers of John the Baptist about. They insisted that their master was greater than Jesus. Even when, after a shocking death by crucifixion, Jesus rose again in triumph, some of the Baptist's followers still refused to believe in him. They were still at work, and confusing Christians, towards the end of the first century and beyond.

In today's Gospel, we hear how John, the Evangelist, counters the arguments of the Baptist's followers. He shows how the Baptist himself acknowledged that Jesus ranked before him because, as he put it, "He existed before me." Correct, Jesus, in his humility, had accepted a rite of baptism at the hands of John the Baptist. But what happened on that occasion revealed his true identity: The sight of the Holy Spirit descending upon him in the form of a dove convinced the Baptist that Jesus was, in fact, the Messiah and would one day baptize his followers in the Holy Spirit. So the Gospel reveals John the Baptist bearing witness to Jesus, proclaiming that he is "the Lamb of God" who takes away our sins, he is "the Chosen One of God," he is eternal, he is the Messiah. Later John would sum up his relationship with Jesus in these simple, humble words: "He must increase, I must decrease."

At the Mass, before receiving Jesus in Holy Communion, we hear the very words that John the Baptist used when first announcing the presence of Jesus: "Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world." What a wonderful blessing it is if we take the announcement as a reminder that we, too, are called to be like John the Baptist to other people. Our Holy Father, Pope Francis, often warns of the dangers of being "self-referential," putting ourselves at the center of everything, the center of our thoughts and desires and hopes. Today we are called to emulate John the Baptist and to be inspired by him. With his unconditional love for the Savior, he is always willing to direct us not to himself but Jesus.

As we have been baptized in the Spirit, we are all invited with God's grace to follow the example of John the Baptist. As Christians, we are all called to point towards Jesus not only by Word of mouth but most of all by in our daily lives live by his standards. Amen.



ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up for the class, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.**

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.




