FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

We want to invite everyone to join us for fellowship and camaraderie today after the 10:00 AM and 11:30 AM Mass for our usual Hospitality Sunday. Our Hospitality Ministry is so generous to serve us with refreshments and drinks as we gather with joy, enthusiasm, and a warm, welcoming attitude most especially to our newly enrolled parishioners. Please make them feel at home in our parish family.

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

A full-page advertisement caught my attention in the Sunday newspaper that featured pictures of a doctor, a lawyer, a musician, and an army officer. Underneath is written in bold: "A vocation, what if you don't have one?" The text continues: "It was the first time I felt envious about anything, a young man told us recently." I looked around the dining hall and realized, with some pain, that there were two sorts of people here: those who had vocations, and the rest of us who did not. The first group knew already what they wanted to do and how to get there. Their lives, I imagined, would be unswerving and purposeful, rich with certainty and fulfillment. The ad tries to dissuade the idea that an uncertain young man has no place in the army. Uncertainty, it argues, is not feeble-mindedness. After all, how can you commit yourself to something you don't know anything about? The military, so the argument goes, will give this uncertain young man time to make up his mind about the future. He will have time to discover if he has what the recruiting officer calls "a vocation for the Army."

It is quite interesting to know that when Matthew writes of the call on the first disciples, there is no suggestion of any hesitation on the part of the four fishermen. Matthew does not tell us why they follow Jesus. His story is quite simple: Jesus calls them, and they follow him. There is no hint where they are going; there is no detailing of what discipleship will involve. Nothing is promised; nothing is signed. Matthew is not interested in these questions. He is more concerned that Jesus called the disciples, and their discipleship requires the leaving of everything that occupied them until that moment.

As we can see, things did not happen as abruptly as that. The disciples did not leave the security of their homes and jobs on the spur of the moment to follow a stranger they had never seen before. The Gospels of Luke and John allow some time for the disciples to find out about Jesus before they are called. In the absence of details, Matthew points to the fact that he wants to focus on something far more critical, and that is the beginning of Jesus' public ministry. With John the Baptist now in prison, the great voice of the wilderness becomes silenced. It is time for Jesus to begin. Matthew shows that Jesus is the fulfillment of the prophecy of Isaiah. Jesus is the great light that dawned. He is the one who begins His mission of proclaiming God's love for all peoples.

Matthew keeps the focus on Jesus and shows the authority of His word and the power of his healing. A Discipleship centered on Jesus. Because of who he is, others will change. Jesus alone is the source of discipleship. Without the person of Jesus, discipleship has no meaning at all. The mission of Jesus is to change the world by changing one person at a time, enable everyone to believe that they are beloved sons and daughters of the one father, God in heaven. Hence, in today's Gospel, we see Jesus at the beginning of His mission to bring this new light, this new revelation into the world. He called the fishermen, Peter, Andrew, James and John, "Follow me, and I will make you fishers of men." With this small group, which gradually increased to twelve, Jesus proclaimed the Good News by teaching and healing. Their mission has to capture the hearts and minds of people, opening up to them the promise of eternal life.

The mission of the disciples of Jesus is still the same. To help all people discover that their true destiny is to live in love with God and with each other. The challenge for us today is to recognize the real darkness. There are so many artificial lights that blind us to the reality of what God wants for us. Many of us believe that personal success and fulfillment lie in the acquisition of wealth and knowledge. We think we know what we want, and we make it our life's mission to achieve it. However, our mission will be very different if we start by asking ourselves: "Who do I think I am?" If I believe that I am a beloved son or daughter of God, then I must begin by asking, "What does God want me to be? When Jesus is the light in my life, I am going to see myself and the world I live in very differently. So let us take up the invitation to follow Jesus. Amen.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

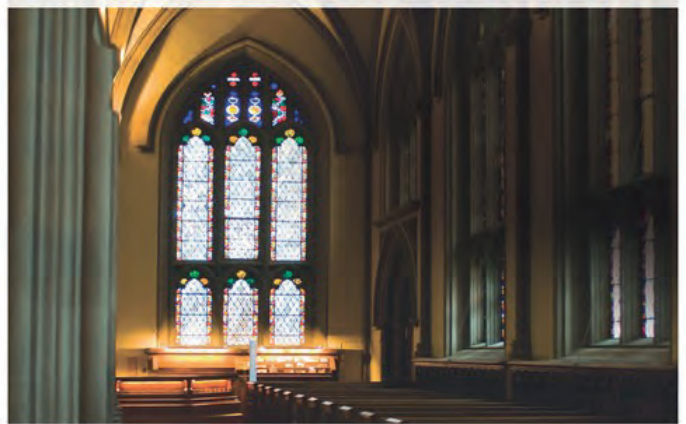

IN THE JANUARY ISSUE OF THE MONITOR MAGAZINE:

FROM THE BISHOP: Sunday of the Word of God

In advance of the new designation of "Sunday of the Word of God" to fall on the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., encourages his flock to prayerfully reflect on the role of the Bible in their spiritual lives. Part of his message follows:

On Sept. 30 of this past year, Our Holy Father Pope Francis issued an apostolic letter "*Aperuit illis*" (translated, "he opened to them," a reference to the Risen Lord's teaching his disciples about the Scriptures before his Ascension). He wrote: "... to set aside moments to reflect upon the great importance of the word of God for everyday living ... to make the sacred Scripture more accessible to believers, to increase their gratitude for so great a gift, and to help them to strive daily to embody and bear witness to its teachings ... I hereby declare that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time (*this year, 2020, that Sunday falls on Jan. 26*) is to be devoted to the celebration, study and dissemination of the word of God."

When first announced, some Catholics responded to his declaration that Pope Francis was "championing the obvious." Really? Most Catholic family homes have a copy of the Bible. But how often do we read it? Other than scriptural references that we may have memorized in Catholic school or religious education classes or some "Bible stories," how familiar are we, as Catholics, with scriptural texts? Maybe the Holy Father is making a good point worth our consideration and even more so, worth our effort.
