

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Allow me to start by greeting our beloved parents, most notably all the Fathers, as we celebrate their day. HAPPY FATHER's DAY! I found an intriguing poem that gives complete tribute to the fathers. The poem reads: "The mender of toys, leader of boys; changer of fuses, kisser of bruises; mover of couches, soother of ouches; pounder of nails, teller of tales; hanger of screens, guide of our teens; fixer of bikes, chastiser of tykes; raker of leaves, cleaner of eaves; drier of dishes, the fulfiller of wishes. God bless you, dear Fathers." We are giving a special blessing to the Fathers at our Masses this weekend.

We are glad to share what has happened and the results of our re-opening last weekend on Public Masses. The parish family of St. Catherine is so blessed to kick-off as we follow the directives and guidelines mandated by the government and our Bishop. The Vigil Mass on Saturday was fantastic as we see our parishioners who came back for the liturgies they missed for the past 12 weeks due to COVID 19 pandemic. Everyone was cooperative and patient as we observe all the protocols for the limited celebration of public Masses. At the Sunday 10:00 a.m. Mass, which is also live streamed, we even had an overflow of a few people, and we sent them to the Parish Hall to join us virtually, and we served them Holy Communion. Overall, our weekend Mass re-opening is a success, and it is encouraging. Please take note that due to an increasing number of parishioners who are attending the 10:00 a.m. Mass on Sunday, there is going to be a priest there who is presiding the liturgy and distributing Holy Communion. A little reminder that we still have COVID 19, and we follow all the regulations and protocols. Our beloved Bishop, David O'Connell, has given us the dispensation of not attending our Sunday and Holy Days of Obligation until September 7, 2020. Hence, if you are not feeling well, not ready to come to Church, or with some infirmities, you are excused and dispensed from the obligation. The parish family is immensely grateful for your understanding and cooperation.

Re-opening and returning to the 'new normal' would not be possible without the help and support of our dedicated parish personnel, so we recognize their zeal and untiring efforts as they work so hard to make things happen. Also, we continue to ask you for your monetary contributions and offertory gifts so that we can provide the essential equipment and other necessary items to keep us safe, healthy, and away from harm due to COVID 19 pandemic. Please keep in mind that we continue to pray for you as we need the spiritual, physical, and psychological strength to overcome these unprecedented challenges. My heart is deeply moved by the generous response of our parishioners who are so aware, and they care so much for the parish community. Thank you so very much. God will surely bestow his great reward for the great things you have done for His Kingdom.

We, as real people, have no doubt that we have fears. It is our Lord who is addressing us in the Gospel three-time over. He bids us not to be afraid. Maybe we could discern in that threefold "Do not be afraid' reference to three kinds of fear that commonly trouble us as human beings.

First, hidden fears, the fears we cannot or will not dare not share with others, like fears about our health, our sinfulness, our future, our dear ones. And there is Jesus, as he says, "Do not be afraid...everything now hidden will be made clear." Indeed, it is already fully revealed to our Father in heaven. He knows all, understands all, through his Son Jesus, urges us not to allow fear to get the better of us.

Second, there is a fear of dangers from outside. Fear of war, the breakdown of law and order, fear of growing violence. And Jesus says, "Do not be afraid of those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul." We have a Father who cares for us.

Finally, there is the fear that we are so small, so insignificant, so unimportant: we feel lost in the immensity of the universe, lost like a speck of dust amidst the billions of people who inhabit the globe, lost as a drop of water is lost in the ocean. We might not dare to say so, but sometimes we find it hard to believe that God, with this vast universe too after, can afford us anything more than a token of divine attention. Jesus says again to us, "there is no need to be afraid": as he has told us, our Father knows what befalls tiny sparrows; and then he adds: "you are worth more than hundreds of sparrows."

An old hymn can remind us, "What a friend we have in Jesus." It is he who brings us new heart, today as, over and over again, he urges us not to be afraid. That doesn't mean that all our fears suddenly vanish, but instead, they don't paralyze us. They no longer dominate our lives, because like the prophet Jeremiah we heard in the first reading, we can say, "The Lord is at my side, a mighty hero." Let us remember that in each Mass brings not only an assurance that Jesus has proved himself our friend, even to the shedding of his blood but also a promise that he takes away our final fear, the fear of what awaits us beyond death. Amen.







We hear how the prophet Jeremiah turned to God as he struggled mentally and emotionally to remain faithful to his call. When do you find yourself turning to God in prayer?


SECOND READING
