

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners.

The Eucharistic Liturgy is the source and summit of the parish community's spiritual and pastoral life. It is the beginning and the end of Christian life. It gives us food and drink for the week to come, so that everything we do, we do in Christ. When we worship and pray together to the ONE Triune God, it is our full and complete expression of our belief and trust in Him and His church. Today the fifth and sixth grade classes of our Religious Education Program are joining us at the 11:30 a.m. Mass. Let us celebrate as one family of God.

FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT

One of the things that I enjoy is attending a comedy club. A friend of mine who is also fond of this for entertainment, shared an interesting story about a comedian who came to Los Angeles, C.A. to perform. His favorite strategy was to look at someone in the audience who appeared uninterested and indifferent, and try to make that individual laugh. He thinks that if he can make that one person in the audience laugh, the rest of the audience will follow suit. Hence, he saw the perfect target in the audience, an old grumpy lady who looked so pensive and serious. All through his performance he kept looking at her. In the meantime, the rest of the audience was having a fun time with his act, but she just looked sterner and sterner. Finally the show has ended and he knew he had to talk to the lady. So he sought her out and said, "By any chance, did you enjoy the show?" "I certainly did," she said, "In fact you were so funny that it was all I could do, to keep myself from laughing."

Paying our Christian duty to pray and worship can sometimes be like that. Going to church is not about enjoying ourselves. But at the same time, it is not meant to be a chore; something we have to do, to make amends with God. That is not what worship means. We worship to be happy. In fact, we have to enjoy God, for enjoyment is a Christian word. Hence, in today's Gospel, Christ refuses to worship the devil, to change stones to bread, to do anything at all which takes him away from the joyful worship of God, His Father.

Keep in mind that we cannot just turn on and off the joy of worship, like hitting the switch on the radio or electricity. Why do we go to Church? We go to Church to be inspired, and this means that we depend on the power of the Holy Spirit. Studies would say, and coming off from the great writers on prayer, that prayer does not always generate a great deal of feeling. The power of the Holy Spirit penetrates the whole human being, and there is more to a human being than feeling.

Is it not that we seek peace in prayer and worship? The technique is to be indifferent to feelings, not to be continually looking for "highs", which might be followed by very deep "lows". Instead we follow our Lord into the desert, to trust in God alone, to live by God's word. Look at Jesus, he also sang hymns at the Last Supper before he went to Gethsemane. Music is a part of the worship of God, and the Psalms are basically songs. The singing does not need to be perfect, but it has to be sincere.

Most of all, keep in mind how important worship is. In the story of Christ's temptation in the wilderness, which we just heard in the Gospel today, the devil was trying to disrupt Jesus' worship. It speaks volumes that the devil saw worship as the most important thing to disrupt in a human life. As we have heard, the devil wanted to be worshipped, not for his own sake, but because idolatry is the best way to stop worshipping God.

All of us are called to worship seriously. For it should not be a distraction from the rest of a good life. Worship when it is done well, takes us into the very core of our lives. Ponder this: a life without worship is a life without meaning. Amen.

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from Ash Wednesday, February 26 until Holy Thursday, April 9, 2020 --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face-to-face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

- The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash
 Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn
 days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below.
- 2. All other Fridays of Lent are days of ABSTINENCE (no meat).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered serious.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the First Sunday of Lent, February 29-March 1 to Trinity Sunday, June 7-8 However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage Catholics to go to Confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month.** To sign up for the class, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office**.

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church. All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.
