FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

Today at the 11:30 a.m. Mass, we as a parish community, are going to witness and pray for our candidates in the RCIA Program. We have the First Scrutiny. Scrutinies, reinforced by an exorcism, is celebrated on Sundays, and they are rites for self-searching and repentance and have, above all, a spiritual purpose. The purpose is to uncover and heal all that is weak, defective, or sinful in the hearts of the elect, to bring about, strengthen all that is upright, strong, and good. We celebrate the Scrutinies to deliver the elect from the power of sin and Satan, to protect them against temptation, and to give them strength in Christ, who is the way, the truth, and the life. Therefore, these rites complete the conversion of the elect, deepen their resolve to hold fast to Christ and to solidify their decision to love God above all. We celebrate the Scrutinies on the Third, Fourth, and Fifth Sundays of Lent in sequence. The first Scrutiny is Mass with the Gospel of the Samaritan Woman, the second is Mass with the Gospel of the Man Born Blind, and the third is Mass with the Gospel of Lazarus.

THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

When two people meet for the first time, they can soon become overwhelmed by the difference between them. The contrast of sex, age, personality, background, religion, nationality, etc. can all contribute to making the encounter short, sharp, and hopeless. The two people might be unable to face each other honestly because the barriers between them seem insurmountable. Nothing will happen unless one of them takes the initiative to overcome the difference between them. And nothing will come of that initiative unless the person is intrigued and responding.

In biblical times the romantic setting was more likely to be a well. A man and a woman meet at a well beyond the edge of town. There, farmers watering their animals might catch glimpses of local women. For example, Isaac's wife, Rebecca, and Moses' wife, Zipporah, were first encountered by their future husbands at wells, and it was at a well that the patriarch, Jacob, met his wife-to-be. Weary from this journey, he rested in the midday heat, to see a beautiful shepherdess coming at this unexpected hour to water her flock. The encounter ended with a kiss, however, Jacob had to wait years before finally making Rachel his bride.

God is patient, too, and not interested in brief flirtations with us. God desires close and enduring relationships. It is the Prophet Hosea who described God's continuing love for the chosen people, despite their unfaithfulness to the covenant, like that of a husband still in love with his unfaithful wife, always trying to win her back.

In writing the story of the woman at the well, John is anxious to tell his readers who Jesus is: he is the Messiah and the Savior of all peoples. But first, he shows us Jesus as the weary and thirsty traveler who wants to make inroads into people's lives. No matter who they are. It is Jesus who makes the first move expressing his need for a drink from her. Thirst knows no boundaries. No doubt, he often encountered people at wells. Samaritans might be reluctant to talk to a Jew, but Jesus could quickly turn everyday chatter into heart-to-heart encounters. We hear echoes of such conversations in today's Gospel. He started by asking for a drink, soon Jesus was saying, in effect: "Come to know the living God. Let God's Spirit become a source of life within you."

Jesus follows the Samaritan woman's cue and talks about the liturgy. But he is not concerned about the proper address to worship God; he is more concerned that the worship of God is given in spirit and truth. Jesus leads the conversation back to where it was. The truth. How can you worship God if you don't face the truth about yourself? What kind of cosmetic worship are we talking about that is not linked to who people are and who they appear to be?

So Jesus tells the woman at the well who he is. Jesus is reluctant to admit to his people that he is the Christ, but he speaks to this outsider who he is. And in sharing, gives himself away to her. He furnishes her the living water, so she can go home without her buckets and jars and face her people.

She does not keep her knowledge a secret. She turns her experience of Jesus into a message for others. Because of her, the whole town came to meet Jesus. Many believe in Jesus because of her story. Many more come to believe in him when they met him for themselves. She is a summary of how people come to understand Jesus, first as a Jew, then as a prophet, then as the Messiah; then as the Savior of the world. How refreshing a message this is for Lent. Perhaps we are weary of the penitential journey, or ashamed that we have not taken it seriously enough. Whatever our past story, God longs to win us back. This Sunday, our Liturgy and the Mass is an invitation to enter into a deeper communion. We only must drink the "living water" of God's Spirit and let it become a source of new life within us. Amen.

First Reading: Exodus 17:3-7

This story from Exodus reveals that the Israelites, after their escape from Egypt, cast all blame for their sufferings on Moses. In this instance, they were dying of thirst. When Moses appealed to the Lord, the Lord directed Moses to strike a rock and water would gush forth.

Second Reading: Romans 5:1-2, 5-8

Paul reminds the Romans that because Christ died for all people, they are acceptable in God's sight.

Gospel: John 4:5-42

Jesus converses with the Samaritan woman at Jacob's Well. When Jesus indicates that whoever drinks from the water He gives will never be thirsty again, the woman immediately answers, "Give me this water, sir...". Jesus then reveals that she has had five husbands and tells her that He is the Messiah. The woman believes Jesus and proclaims this news to all the townspeople, who believe her and come to see Jesus.

Diocese issues advisory on coronavirus concerns

In light of the escalating concern about the spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19),

Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., has issued the following instructions on liturgical practices to be observed in ALL parishes, institutions and organizations within the Diocese of Trenton, effective immediately until otherwise notified:

1. People who have flu-like symptoms or who are otherwise feeling sick should not go to Mass or other Church gatherings;
2. Priests, deacons and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion should practice good hygiene, washing hands with soap and water or anti-bacterial hand sanitizer, before and after distributing Holy Communion;
3. People are encouraged not to receive Holy Communion on the tongue; worthy, reverent reception by hand is preferred until otherwise notified;
4. The practice of distributing the Precious Blood from the Chalice is suspended;
5. The practice of exchanging the sign of peace by any physical contact (handshake, embrace, kissing) is suspended.

ANOINTING OF THE SICK: To schedule an anointing, call the Pastor's Office at 732-938-5375 OPT. 7.

BAPTISM: We celebrate Baptism on the second Sunday of each month at 12:30 PM or during the 11:30 AM Mass. Prior to scheduling the baptism of your child, sponsor certificates, donation, and attendance at a **Baptism Preparation Class** is required. Classes are held in Classroom 10 on the **4th Sunday of the month**. To sign up for the class, please fill out the registration form on our website for the date you wish to attend. Godparents/sponsors are also encouraged to attend. **Baptism Arrangements must be made in advance by contacting the Parish Office.**

HOMEBOUND: If a homebound family member, friend, or neighbor would like to receive Holy Communion, visits, or calls, please contact the Parish Office.

MATRIMONY: Couples planning a marriage must contact the Parish Office to begin marriage preparation at least one year before the anticipated wedding date.

RCIA: The process by which adults become Catholic and/or receive the Sacraments is called Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults. RCIA meets the 1st & 3rd Tuesday of each month at 7 PM.

SPONSOR CERTIFICATES: In order to obtain a sponsor certificate at St. Catherine of Siena Parish, the following is required: **Registration in the parish for at least 6 months prior to the request; received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation; if married, married in the Catholic Church; be at least 16 years of age; attending Mass faithfully participating in the life of the Church, receiving the Eucharist and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.** All requests are approved by the Pastor. Please contact the Parish Office to confirm your registration status.

OBTAIN A MASS CARD: We welcome all who would like to request their special intentions or deceased loved ones be prayed for at weekday or weekend Mass. Please call or stop by the Parish Office.

PRAYER LIST: Please call the Parish Office to request a name be added or removed to our prayer list.

LOW GLUTEN HOST: An extremely low-gluten (37 micrograms) host is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest or the Deacon prior to the beginning of the Mass you are attending.

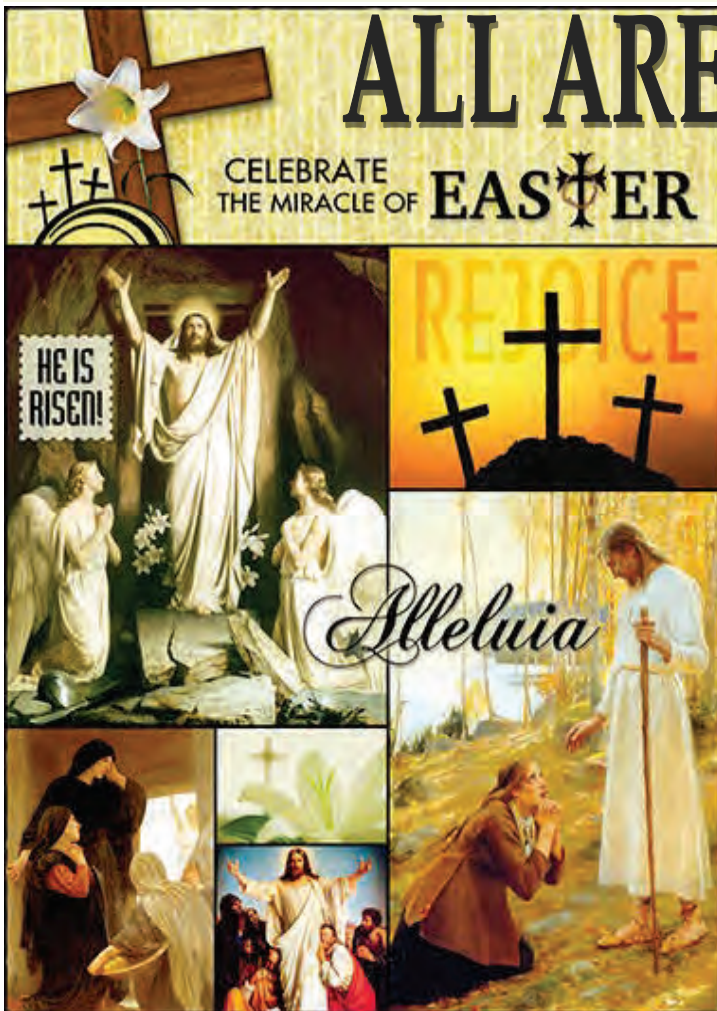
