

#### FROM THE PASTOR

#### Dear Parishioners.

Believe it or not, we are already in the season wherein we experience gray and darker days, literally and figuratively speaking. As we move forward, please be reminded that Daylight Savings Time ends this weekend, so we must turn our clocks back an hour. Hence, we are going to have extra time to sleep or other things. A little bit of an adjustment, but we can get used to it anyway. Despite this unprecedented time, we continue to live in love as children of light. Remove from our minds that holiness is being sinless. We realize that being holy, being whole, and perfect is a process of being filled with God. Let us be grateful for the many blessings we have received, especially those we never asked from the Lord and yet He generously has given us. Most importantly, let us be sincere and truthful in our love for the Lord through our neighbors, let us take off our masks of hypocrisy.

#### SOLEMNITY OF ALL SAINTS

It's amazing to discover that each of us is called to be holy—what a wonderful calling! Allow me to mention a saint who was canonized last year, St. John Henry Newman. At the age of 15, he became aware of his own existence and that of God. He had the thought of "two of two, and two only, absolute and luminously self-evident beings, myself and my Creator." He had a heartfelt sense that this would last into the next life and that he was elected to eternal glory. The wonderful experience of the Creator made him feel extremely humble, and so he wrote, "I thought only of the mercy to myself." This basic event led him to search for the truth and deepen the faith journey he began in baptism.

We hear from Jesus that he is "the Way, the truth and the Life." In the Beatitudes, he reveals the attitudes which shape and form us to become saints. While baptism is the remarkable beginning of Christian life, it is also the gift of a calling to become a saint. Each one of us has a personal calling from God. For many of us, it is living out love in family life, in the day to day relationships of taking care of children, loving one's spouse and having time and care for aging and elderly parents. For some, it is a calling to the vocation to the priesthood, the consecration of religious life, and for others, a committed single life that reaches out to others. We ought to remember that God's call is always a call to go beyond ourselves in love. Amen.

#### THE COMMEMORATION OF ALL THE FAITHFUL DEPARTED

This year, due to the public health crisis, we will not have the usual celebration to remember in the Mass our faithful departed by lighting a candle for each deceased who departed on the previous year. Hopefully, in the future, as we move forward and we are back in the new normal of things, we will be able to honor them in this most special way.

This feast of All Souls is an opportunity to continue our tradition from the days of the earliest Church, of remembering, and praying for, the souls of all who have died in Christ: for their eternal rest in peace. Believing that Christ died and was raised from the dead, opening the gates of heaven to us, we also recognize that even those who die in the light of faith may still need purification. Our prayers, and the prayers of all people throughout time, assist them in this final step of the journey toward heaven. And the highest form of prayer is the celebration of the Mass.





Jesus' Sermon on the Mount (Matt 5-7) begins with a listing of beatitudes. How do you think you measure up to these beatitudes?


Prayer for the Faithful Departed
