FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

A young man wanted to find God, so he decided to go into a big, ornate, and beautiful church. He expected that in the spaciousness, light, and reflection of the stained glass and glittering mosaics, he might experience God. Filled with feelings of God's closeness, he put his head down on the back of a pew. A few minutes later, he felt a tapping on his shoulder. Looking up, he saw an elderly lady. She asked: "Are you hungry? I could give you a few dollars to get something to eat?" Realizing the risk and the effort the woman had taken to approach him and the simple manifestation of care and love that prompted it, the man thanked her but said he was alright. A few minutes later, he left the church knowing that he had found God.

God can be experienced wherever he is present. We are already in the season that calls upon us most especially to let the least fortunate and needy, discover that despite the challenges, trials, and adversities, we are here for them as Jesus has entrusted us. And we have to respond. Our parish is receiving calls, with many people are asking us if we are having our annual Gift Tree Collection of Gifts this year. Due the pandemic, COVID 19, we have to amend it from the usual fashion of taking of gift tags, as we want to be safe, away from harm, and healthy this Christmas season and always. We want to be smart as we abide by the health restrictions. Keep in mind that the goal stays the same: to provide help and respond to the less privileged and the poor's felt needs, especially this Christmas season. The majority of families in need, along with he community schools and organizations that we support are not accepting physical gifts such as toys and clothing, etc. Rather they are asking for Gift Cards this year. The parish asks you to consider giving donations for this wonderful cause kindly. Words are not enough to express our thanks and gratitude in advance. The parish family invites you to honor your loved one this Christmas by offering a CHRISTMAS FLORAL MEMORIAL. This is our traditional project as we put your name, along with the names of those you honor, and will be published in our Christmas Bulletin. It is a noble campaign for many NJ active soldiers as they go home for the Christmas season to their families and have a joy-filled celebration. THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It is interesting to see how people, especially the young, would write words as so many use short cuts learned from texting. Similarly, parents sometimes complain when their children would use "slang" language. Young people, however, are not the only ones who cut corners. Few of us use the formal word "Sir/Madam" these days. I remember I received a phone call from a parishioner: "Do you guys...?" I gently corrected her, "I am Father,"... and finally, she realized that she is talking to a priest, and she apologized. It is noticeable that just as we take short cuts in our journeys, we economize in the way we speak. A servant of God, however, is always called to go that extra mile. Love overrides "the principle of the least effort." It goes out of its way to do everything possible. We do not ask, "How little can I get away with?" but "What else may I do?" Please be reminded that the kingdom of God operates by the principle of utmost effort, not least.

Reading our Gospel today, Jesus tells the story of three servants to whom a rich man entrusted his fortune. Imposing loans on people was common in ancient times as a profitable way to deposit cash. Two of his employees were delighted to have such trust placed in them. After all, a talent was a coin value, and he had lent them five and ten talents apiece. Eager to please him, they showed enterprise in their use of his money, unlike the third servant, who wanted to save himself any trouble or anxiety. He dug a hole and buried it.

God does not exploit people, nor was Jesus a financial advisor. He was interested in a different kind of treasure. God is rich in kindness, and we are distributors of that grace. What God bestows is not meant to be hoarded. God gives us wisdom and skill that we might treat other people generously. Such is the "commerce" of God's kingdom: a reckless investment of ourselves with no certainty of return, other than to increase the circulation of love in this world. Money was not the issue. The master did not suggest how the money might be used, nor did he equal all. St. Paul exhorts us, "Having gifts that differ according to the grace given to us, let us use them. (Rom. 12:6) He also tells us, "There are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in everyone." (1 Cor.12:4-6) God knows each one of us, and He treats us personally. Amen.





In his parable of the talents, Jesus teaches about the importance of using our God-given gifts faithfully and prudently. What would be a natural gift you have used well in your life?


