FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

American THANKSGIVING originated as a harvest festival, and to this day, the centerpiece of Thanksgiving celebration remains Thanksgiving dinner. Our experience would show that the traditional dinner consists of foods and dishes, namely turkey, potatoes, stuffing, squash, corn, green beans, cranberries, and pumpkin pie. On a personal note, being a Filipino, when I visit some close friends and family members, I would eat chicken, ham, and the famous pancit (noodles). Thanksgiving Day is regarded as the beginning of the Fall/Winter holiday season, including Christmas and the New Year in American culture.

Our parish's community celebration of Thanksgiving Day begins at 9 AM by having the Eucharistic Liturgy. What a way to express our gratitude, appreciation, and thanks to the Divine Master as we come together as one family of faith in Church for the Mass. It's a bit different liturgy due to the public health crisis, and we must adhere to the protocols. Still, our noble intentions of prayer and thanksgiving are valuable and important as it comes from the bottom of our hearts. There are many things to be thankful for despite the unprecedented time. There is no need to point it out right now in as much as they are private and personal, but a day of thanksgiving as one nation, one people of faith is necessary. Let us keep our faith alive and vibrant. Let us share the good news as God gave one another the gift of faith. Have a blessed and Happy Thanksgiving to all.

OUR LORD JESUS CHRIST THE KING OF THE UNIVERSE

People may find that they are uncomfortable with the idea of Christ as king, for it suggests an archaic and outdated view of society and government. Then it might be useful to think about how the Scripture views the idea of what it means to be a king. The first thing is, the human ruler, with an exception, was always male, was not regarded as having absolute power. The king was God's representative, and his chief function was to be a unifying force among the people, most especially in matters of justice. If the king exceeded royal powers, it was the prophet's duty to remind him that he was not above the law of God. The person regarded as the ideal ruler was David, the shepherd who was anointed to govern Israel in God's name and be the focal point of unity for the 12 tribes.

God is a mystery. We can keep trying to understand the mystery, even though we can never do so fully. We can only speak about God in terms that make sense to ourselves, so if we use the title "king," we might remember that the most important aspect of this concerning Jesus is his being the focus of unity. His throne is the cross, and, as the Gospel of John tells us, the hour of his being glorified on the cross is when he will draw all people to himself.

We are God's people in the world. Hence it is our task and responsibility to live so that we reveal to those around us the kind of God we believe in. Let us be reminded that when we celebrate the Eucharist together, we gather around the person of Jesus: Holy Communion is not only and simply an act of personal devotion, but a sign that we are united with those with whom we worship. In a world where there are so many divisions, our parish community could be a great gathering of people with a common purpose where mutual respect and acceptance are evident. We are all trying to live according to what Jesus expects us to.

Keep in mind that the last judgment is not all about charity. It is about justice. It is necessary to do something about the actual situation in which some people find themselves, which comes under the heading of charity. Similarly, it is equally important to address the causes of why people's lives are in such a mess, and this is a matter of justice.

Loving Father, we thank you for becoming one with us in the life, death, and resurrection of Christ the King. You reconciled humanity and divinity in Him and helped us follow Christ the King by reconciling us with one another as we deepen our union with you. Amen.




