### FROM THE PASTOR

#### Dear Parishioners,

We are congratulating the Knights of Columbus! The founder of the Knights of Columbus has beatified last Saturday, October 31, in the Archdiocese of Hartford in Connecticut. He is now closer to sainthood. Here in our diocese, Bishop David O' Connell will be hosting a Mass for the Knights of Columbus in honor of the beatification on Saturday, November 14, at 10:30, AM in the Co-Cathedral. Due to the pandemic restrictions, attendance will be limited to 200. Father McGivney is a son of Irish immigrants. His young childhood was difficult due to poverty, rejection, and all the complexities faced by so many immigrants. His father died when he was young, and due to his death, the grip of poverty struck the whole family. This unhappy life experience of his family led the way for Father McGivney to start a small group of men in his parish to support and help immigrant assist their families. Amazingly, the small group grew to become the world-wide, largest, Catholic Men's Organization, known as the Knights of Columbus. We would like to continuously encourage and call on our parish community's men to consider joining our own parish council of Knights of Columbus. We need more members. Our Council has been and continue to be, accommodating and supportive of our parish ministries and events.

The celebration of All Saints Day in the parish yesterday is quite remarkable. We have a significant visitor, the Diocesan Torch of Our Lady of Guadalupe, Our Blessed Virgin Mary, and we have the Torch until Friday, November 6. Sadly, many parishes have been affected in this year of a pandemic by losing loved ones in their communities. As Christians, we turn to our faith in times of difficulties, distress, and uncertainty as we do in times of joy and success, and we celebrate. Since Mary is the Mother of Christians on earth, in heaven and purgatory, this year, the procession of the Our Lady of Guadalupe Torches will be in remembrance of those who, due to the COVID-19 virus or any other kind of infirmity or circumstance, have lost their lives. During November, Catholics are called to increase our devotion to praying for the holy souls of our dearly departed; the Our Lady of Guadalupe Torch should lead us on a pilgrimage of remembrance.

The Guadalupe Torch will shine in the parishes as a symbol of the impassioned prayer of those who participate in the diocesan- wide mission. The light of the torch also reminds us that our Lady of Guadalupe is present in these moments of prayer and advocating our requests to her Son, Jesus, who we know will never deny her anything. We keep in mind also that in this time of recollection, that if the souls of the ones we loved so much here on earth have already passed on into heaven, we have the honor of joining them with Our lady of Guadalupe and all the saints in heaven, in the highest act of supernatural charity, which is, praying for the souls who have no one to pray for them and need God's mercy.



The season, the weather, and atmosphere has changed tremendously. We are still amid the public health crisis and with that we must be adaptable. Please know the parish will amend our annual Giving Tree Collection of Gifts in the usual fashion of taking of gift tags this year as we want all to be safe, away from harm, and healthy this Christmas season. As much as we abide by the COVID-19 restrictions, it is necessary this year that we modify our ways. We announce that our parish Good Samaritan Ministry will aid our community with this Christmas initiative, Project Joy. Nevertheless, the purpose stays the same: to provide help and respond to the less fortunate and needy this Christmas season. The majority of the families in need, along with the community schools and local organizations that we support are not accepting physical gifts such as toys and clothing, etc. Rather they are asking for gift cards this year to uphold the COVID-19 restrictions. We kindly ask you to consider giving donations for this wonderful cause. Thank you so much in advance, and we appreciate your generosity.

#### THIRTY-SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The parable's focal point of the foolish and wise bridesmaids is not just about being alert to the coming of Christ on judgment day, or even on the day of our own death. It is about having the sense of our soul finely tuned to detect God's presence in all aspects of our human living. This also means that God's presence around us requires a response on our part. The Gospel tells us that when Christ demands an account of our lives on judgment day, we will not be asked about our liturgical correctness or our enthusiasm for religious observance. We will be asked if we fed those who are hungry, clothed those who were naked, were compassionate with those sick and imprisoned, and welcomed the stranger. Our capacity to "touch the suffering flesh of Christ in others," as Pope Francis has said, is the proof of our wisdom and devotion. Amen.


### Prayer for the Faithful Departed
