

FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

It's unbelievable, but it's true, we are amid the pandemic. Yet by God's special grace, we can continue with our parish life and have started to celebrate the sacraments following all the protocols and directives mandated by the government and by the Bishop. We are happy to share with you we are back on our regular schedule of Masses, and the outcome and results are so encouraging and positive, not mention the impressive attendance of our faithful people. Our parishioners are glad to be in Church for the Sunday liturgies as they consider worship, prayers, and thanksgiving are so essential and valuable. They are fed with the Word of God and the Bread of Life, the front and center of our Sunday liturgy in the Mass's Eucharistic celebration. Let us spread the word to others, as we invite and give them our warmest welcome. As one community of believers and friends of Jesus, let us continue to bring back our trust and confidence in coming back to Church.

This past weekend our liturgy commenced with the celebration of the Sacrament of Confirmation for our eighth-grade students, and we are going to continue with the confirmation sessions this Friday and Saturday, respectively. We ask for your fervent prayers for all the candidates of confirmation so that they may be able to receive the gift of the Holy Spirit as they go on with their lives, moving in the right direction and continuing on the right path with God guiding them.

This Sunday is CATECHETICAL SUNDAY, and it is a special day for catechists and everyone who helps at the Religious Education Program. Equally essential to mention is the RCIA team, who leads, educates, guides, and forms our adults who have the strong desire to be Catholic and have full communion with our Catholic Christian faith. As your Pastor, I am going to do the Blessing at the 11:30 Mass. Keep in mind that YOU are the pillars of the Church.

TWENTY-FIFTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Reflecting and reading the Gospel today, don't think that Jesus was advocating some strange new social teaching when he told the story of an employer who did this. The key to his parable is in words, "Why be envious because I am generous?" It is a parable about the extraordinary generosity and love of God. It is not about human rights; it is, as Jesus said, it is about God's kingdom.

In reading the parable, people are waiting around the marketplace, idle, lost, and unemployed, perhaps misbehaving. Although they are not aware of it, they are waiting for the Good News. Along comes the landowner who, of course, is Jesus, and a group of them take up his invitation to work in his vineyard. Meaning comes to their life at once, as they are gainfully employed in the kingdom. They are working for God in the sense of fulfilling their purpose in life, living life in a way that is pleasing to God.

And the wages they receive will be eternal life. Some hear the call later in life, and their reward is the same. Even at the eleventh hour, some people respond to his call, and among them, they may think about the penitent thief on the cross: "Today you will be with me in paradise." Here is a beautiful picture of Jesus walking into his Father's presence, leading this man by the hand: "Here, Father, is the man I have saved." How completely appropriate that the savior brings with him the sheep that was lost; that the first to enter God's kingdom with him was a thief.

Keep in mind for God; everything is of infinite value. When we love as Christ loves, without a hint of judgment, we want to see everyone saved and in God's kingdom, even those who are addicted and tied into a sinful kind of life. Some have not yet come to believe, those who are hostile to the Church or consumed with selfishness or pride, those whose lives have fallen apart. The Church extends this mercy and kindness of God by preaching what Jesus came to seek and save those who are lost. Let us remember the Lord continues to open his arms to all of us. Amen.
