## FROM THE PASTOR

Dear Parishioners,

As we prepare for the opening of our Religious Education Program, come Sunday, October 17, we continue to announce and call your attention to volunteering. We need catechists, aides, and hall monitors to lend us a helping hand. Please consider sharing one's precious time as we move forward to form and educate our children about their faith. They are the future of the Church. Parents, most especially the mothers, are supposed to be the first and primary teachers of the child's religion, as the Blessed Virgin Mary had shown to us through Jesus when he was a child. Would you please heed our call and respond to our pleas? In advance, we would like to express our most profound appreciation and immense gratitude to all who listened and responded to the call of Jesus, our Master and Teacher.

### TWENTY-SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Death is inevitable, but we need not die as sinners. Death need not always be tragic, but the death of a sinner is always tragic. This is what Jesus says in today's Gospel. A cup of water offered in the name of Jesus will not go unrewarded. We appreciate the delicacy and refinement of this thought. But His following statement jolts us out of our spiritual smugness. Jesus says, "Whoever causes one of these little ones who believe in Me to sin, it would be better for him if a great millstone were put around his neck and he were thrown into the sea." Gone are the fine sentiments and delicate feelings. Here it seems to be a violent cry for hot vendetta—both issuing from the mouth of Jesus, at the same breath, to boot.

Why this fierce attack on sin? Because it prevents one from entering into and enjoying the Kingdom of God. In the Kingdom of God, physical deformities and material deprivations do not matter. It is no use to have all material comforts and the best physical form and shape but, perhaps because of them, to be deprived of enjoying eternal happiness. This explains Jesus' severe and stern stand against sin.

These days most people do not like to hear anything about hell. Many even try to deny the existence of hell. Preachers are often hesitant to preach about hell for fear of being called old-fashioned, pre-Vatican.

No matter if we like to hear about it or not, the message of today's Gospel comes to us loud and clear. It is true that when we desire to hear something sweet and pleasant, we are not interested in hearing about sin and hell. But the words of Jesus are never old-fashioned or irrelevant. If we do not want to be thrown into the rubbish dump, we need to give special attention to these words of Jesus.

In the Gospel of today, Jesus speaks about hell. When he does that, he uses a word that does not appear in the text because it was translated into English. He uses the word Gehenna, one of the words for hell. Because Jesus used that word, the Jews and others in Jerusalem who listened to him knew what he was talking about. They had seen that place, and they had smelled it. Maybe they were even standing in its smoke while He spoke. They had seen the worms crawling through that part of the place where the fire had not yet reached. We think of something we never saw, smelled, heard, or felt when we think of hell.

Gehenna was the ever-burning rubbish dump of Jerusalem where the city council workers emptied all the trash of the town. Knowing this, we might understand better Jesus' message. You know what ends up in trash: uneaten spoiled food, wrappings, empty bottles, cans, cartons, rubbish, garbage, all things we cannot use, broken and nonfunctioning items.

That is why Jesus said: "If you are not useful in the building of the Kingdom ----human life, the human family, human community---- you are going to end up in the rubbish camp or Gehenna."

Jesus does not say one will burn there eternally. He says that fire is eternal, And he suggests that all the useless items will be burned to ashes in that fire. This is so close to the culture of other nations where one tries to destroy and wipe out the memory of an evil person who dies to ward off one's influence. So we should be useful and helpful, well-functioning cells or organs in His Kingdom, in whatever we do or decide not to do.

Loving Father, make us an active and responsible member of your Kingdom. Amen.

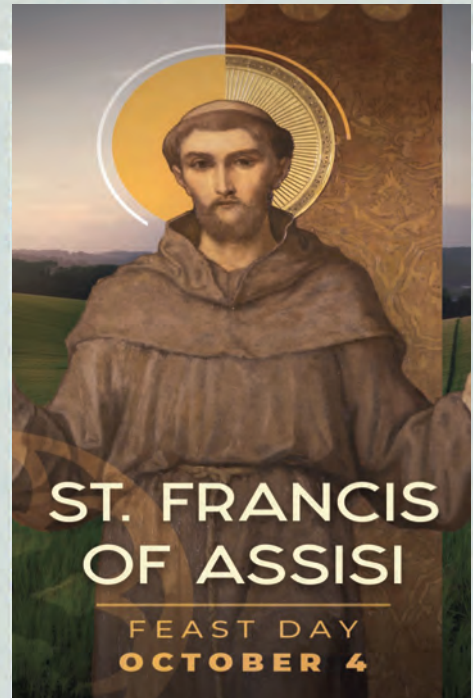

### **Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/ Letters of Eligibility**

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

**A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.**

*Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.*

Do you hear the Lord calling you to share your gift of faith? What's stopping you? Fear of not having enough knowledge of your faith to share. Doubts of whether you can find the time to make a weekly commitment. Wondering if you will be an effective teacher if you have no formal teaching experience? All legitimate concerns! But here's the truth: Teaching and sharing your faith is simple. There is only one requirement: the desire to help.

I am a religious education teacher. I do not have a formal teaching certificate. But I love my faith which is all I need to be effective in my role as catechist. All the material I require for preparation of my lessons are provided. The catechist's books are simple to understand, and the lesson guide provides more than enough material for each class.

I have learned a lot over the years about my religion, but I find that teaching has helped me to learn even more. As the saying goes, "The teacher becomes the student"!

The best part of being a catechist is I get to share my love of Jesus with others. I want my students to get to know Him on a personal level: Include him in their daily lives; Turn to him in good times and bad; Tell Him their desires, joys sorrows, concerns. Get to know Him on a personal level - pictures of Him, where He lived, His family life. Take Him out of Scripture and place Him before them to talk to.

Right now, students have a lot on their plates, as we all do. Helping them to focus on what's important in this life is difficult but so important! I pray that if my students don't remember a word I say now, maybe someday when, they need Him the most, they will remember He's there!

I love being a catechist, you will too.

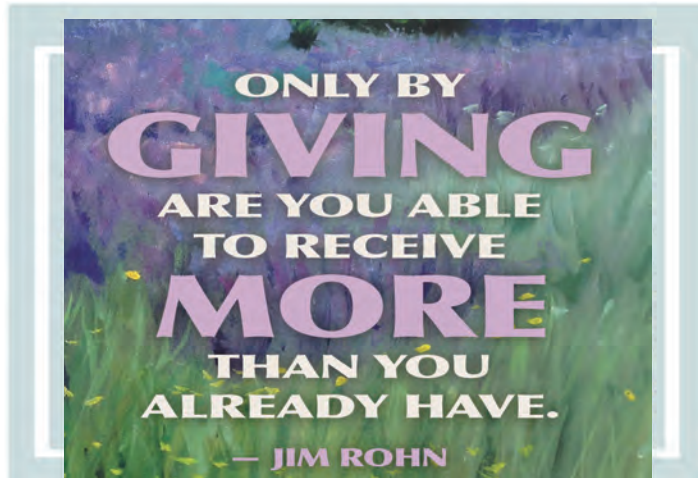
