

A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

We begun the Easter season; and it is fifty days from the Sunday of the Resurrection to Pentecost Sunday, which we celebrate in joy and exultation. Fifty days of "dwelling in" the paschal mystery. Fifty days of surrendering in joyful faith and love as the Spirit of God takes possession of our lives. These are the days above all others in which we sing the ALLELUIA. Notice that the



Paschal Candle, a symbol of the presence of the risen Christ among the people of God, remains in the sanctuary near the Altar through Pentecost Sunday. Together with all the candles in the sanctuary, they are all lit throughout the Easter season.

SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER—DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

The conversions and inner and physical healings in spiritual prayer group meetings have but one source: the risen Christ. Surrender to the Lord to be filled with the spirit of the Lord, and to be a witness of the Lord, are basic to the Christian way of living as this has been and will always be the characteristic of every committed Christian. Therefore, in His first encounter with the disciples, the risen Lord gives them His spirit and sends them as His witnesses. The risen Lord is alive evermore! As we listen to the second reading, His power of healing and converting has been working in the lives of men and women.

As we hear the Gospel reading, Christ's remark to Thomas is especially relevant in the context of prayer group meetings. Since the total man experiences the risen Lord, one's experience of the Lord in faith can overflow the senses, though not necessarily. In other words, the faith experience of the Lord can lead to the sensory experience of the Lord. But to sense satisfaction and sense-assurance rather than the knowledge of the Lord in faith is dangerous and reprehensible. The vision of and gifts from the Lord are poor substitutes for the Lord Himself.

"Blessed are those who have not seen and yet believe..." these are written as St. John ends his Gospel---'that you may believe and Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that believing, you may have life in His name." Believe and live--- faith and life—how are those two interconnected in us? Blessed are we if we believe and live in Jesus.

During those moments of darkness, disillusionment and despair, the Lord broke in upon them and enlightened their gloomy minds with the sunshine of his forgiving grace. The Lord did not abandon them, although they failed him miserably. What a beautiful example of God's unconditional love. It is hard to keep up the flame of faith and hope when misfortunes befall us, when persecutions arise or the search for reason and facts is futile. Like the apostles, we are reluctant to accept the risen Lord. Often, we fail Christ wretchedly and without excuse, but today's Gospel assures us of the 'gift of peace,' and so let us not allow our past to crush us but let us shake it off, rise above it, humbly accept God's gracious gift of peace.

Experience has shown us how unstable are our sturdiest and strongest resolutions, how frail and undependable our fickle hearts. Yes, we cannot manage without Christ. Christ does not ask the impossible from us. He gives what makes the impossible possible. So, he breathed on them and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit." St. Thomas was blessed with the presence of Christ.

John saw the risen Lord clearly in a vision, the One who died but is alive evermore, holding the keys of death and hades. Belief in the risen Lord was the source of his power and strength. Christ commissioned him to write down the 'Revelation' so that people could believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God and that they could live in and for Him.

Lord, help me to believe even against all odds. Amen.

Recommendations to fittingly observe the Feast of Divine Mercy we should:

- 1. Celebrate the Feast on the Sunday after Easter.
- 2. Sincerely repent of all our sins.
- 3. Place our complete trust in Jesus.
- 4. Go to Confession, preferably before that Sunday.
- 5. Receive Holy Communion on the day of the Feast.
- 6. Venerate the Image of the Divine Mercy.
- 7. Be merciful to others through our actions, words, and prayers on their behalf.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Life is about to get very interesting for the disciples. Finding themselves questioning what happened to Jesus and whether he actually was raised from the dead, they are afraid and uncertain. In the midst of this fear, questioning, and uncertainty, Jesus decides to surprise them with a visit! This visit, complete with the gift of peace, fills the disciples with great excitement and joy. But their detailed testimony is not enough to convince their absent friend Thomas. He wants to see for himself. We struggle with belief as well. It is hard for some to give themselves over to the testimony of another. We want to see the resurrected Christ in person. God, through the gift of eyes of faith, gives us the ability to do precisely that: when we witness the healing that comes from forgiveness, the beauty that flows from love, the wonder of creation, the new life that comes after we fall, and the unique soul that lives behind each person's life. Christ is risen. Life will get very interesting for us too, when we stop unbelieving and believe!



SAINT OF THE WEEK

Central America's first saint, St. Pedro de San José Betancur (1626-1667) was born a poor shepherd in the Canary Islands. His family lands were seized because of debt, and he worked as an indentured servant until his early adult life when Pedro left his home to travel to Guatemala. His money for the journey ran out long before he arrived. He was destitute when he did arrive and was forced to join the bread line the Franciscan Friars had for the poor.

In 1655, he joined the Third Order of St Francis. Pedro began to serve the poor, the enslaved, immigrants, abandoned children, anyone that needed him. In 1658 he was given a hut which he made into a hospital for the poor. This small start grew into a shelter for the homeless, a school for the poor, an inn for priests, and several small chapels in poor areas. He was supported by many patrons and was joined in his work by both men and women, who became the Bethlehemite Brothers and the Bethlehemite Sisters.

Pedro prayed for the souls of those in purgatory, walked through the streets of rich neighborhoods ringing a bell and calling the wealthy to repent, and ministered to prisoners. Most accounts credit him with beginning the tradition of posadas, a procession in which people representing Mary and Joseph ask for lodging from their neighbors. This tradition continues today in Mexico and Central America. Because of his work with the poor and marginalized Pedro is often referred to as the "Saint Frances of the Americas". St. Pedro was canonized on July 30, 2002, in Guatemala City, Guatemala by Pope John Paul II.





SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the <u>parish in whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.




