A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners,

Once again, the Annual Catholic Appeal is here. Pledge Sunday for the ACA is February 19 and 20 throughout the Diocese of Trenton. As we know, each year, the Bishop seeks the wholehearted support of all the diocese members further the work of our ministries. Let us keep in mind that each of us has a vital part in all we do in Christ's name, and each one of us can share in all we do with a gift to the Annual Catholic Appeal.

Our beloved parish is receiving almost eight thousand dollars from last year's ACA because we surpassed our goal. As your Pastor, I appeal to your kind heart to give our gifts to the ACA as we heed the Bishop's call and get our fair share from the appeal. We have had a couple of big snowstorms this winter season, and the expense for the snow removal, clean-up, etc., is costly. The money that we are receiving this month from the past year's ACA will be used and utilized for our parish maintenance and upkeep of the buildings and grounds, particularly the snow removal. Please take a moment and truly reflect on any help you can give. This year St. Catherine of Siena Parish's share of the goal is \$40,000. The Diocese goal for this year is \$ 6.5 million.

You have always been accommodating and supportive of the Diocese and the Parish. The level of support and your generosity is truly remarkable. My sincere gratitude to all. May God continue to bless each one of you as well as your family.

SIXTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The lilies of the field do fade and are destroyed by drought. The birds of the air must struggle for life., Adverse weather affects them too and Jesus knew it. So Jesus is not naïve. He wants us to learn a lesson from them, the lesson of trust, to be quiet and serene despite everything that surrounds us in our daily lives.

Blessed, happy indeed is the one who trusts in the Lord. Who can trust in God? No one, by his own power. We rationalize, analyze, despair, and give up; it seems impossible to trust in God! But Jesus' words are inexorable: look at the lilies of the field. He looked his people while hanging on the cross and, from this tragic heat, burst forth the cry: "Why have you abandoned me?" From the depth of his acute sense of abandonment issued not a cry of despair but of supreme childlike TRUST: "Into your hands, Father, I entrust my life". Neither naiveté nor escapism, but a life of trust, trust unto death. How is this possible? It is possible for, at the center of the Good News of Jesus stands Abba-Daddy-Papa. It is this Abba who enables us to trust by showing Himself as loving.

These days no one will easily consider those who are poor, those who weep, those who go hungry or are persecuted, as 'lucky people' or 'happy people.' Jesus never meant to say that to be poor, to weep, to go hungry, or to be persecuted are good things. God never intended such things for man; man brought these things upon himself through sin. Jesus wants us to do all we can to eradicate poverty, and improve our standard of living. During his life, Jesus felt sorry for his people's miserable conditions, and he tried to help them. What Jesus asks us is to avoid our tendency to put our trust in ourselves, and our possessions, or in people who are powerful and famous.

The danger is that some people feel they can manage even without the help of God. And so, some make themselves as gods and worship themselves. But those who put their trust in the Lord are aware of their weaknesses. They are convinced that God is ready always to lend them his strength. And because such people know what suffering means, they are compassionate with those who suffer and are always prepared to help the needy. It is these such people that Jesus calls in the 'beatitudes' happy, blessed people. Someone once said: "It is not the possession of good things that bring happiness; it is the ability to enjoy what comes. Happiness is an attitude."






SAINT OF THE WEEK

The history of St. Conrad of Piacenza is quite fascinating. A member of one of the most noble families of Piacenza, he was known for his utmost honesty. One day while out hunting with friends, he thought he saw some game in an area of brush and ordered his attendants to set fire to the brush in order to scare it out of hiding. Unfortunately, the dry brush quickly ignited, and fire started to spread. Soon, the surrounding area was engulfed in flames.

Unfortunately, a known arsonist happened to be in the same area as the fire. This man was later imprisoned, tried, and condemned to death for the damage. But on his way to his execution, St. Conrad of Piacenza, full of guilt, stopped the proceedings and confessed to the fire. To make restitution for the damages, Conrad had to sell all his belongings, which reduced him to poverty. Soon after, he decided to retire to a hermitage, where he became a hermit of the Third Order of St. Francis, and his wife entered the Order of Poor Clares.



SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Low Gluten Host

An extremely low-gluten host (37 micrograms) is available for those in need. Please notify the Priest prior to the beginning of Mass.



REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering a parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.






