

A Message from our Pastor

Dear Parishioners.

THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

Allow me to share with you an inspiring story. A suitor in Wales rebuffed for forty-two years eventually won his fair lady. After writing 2,184 love letters, the persistent but rather shy man, receiving neither written nor spoken answer, summoned enough courage to present himself in person. He knocked on the lady's door and asked for her hand. To his delight and surprise, she accepted! The couple married at 74 years of age.

Jesus, after His baptism, was led by the Spirit for forty days in the wilderness and allowed himself to be tempted by the devil. There in those long days of honest self-searching and His communion with God, He perceived the purpose of His life. He returned from there with a solid determination to carry out that purpose. Even though He had to reaffirm with determination not to let His concern for people's physical needs, poverty and sicknesses, and desire for some immediate material advantage divert Him from ministering to their empty souls.

A clear purpose gave meaning to his life. He had a solid determination to go ahead. No wonder he was able to take a surprising number of shocks and bumps on the outside without suffering severe setbacks.

At Nazareth, on the Sabbath, when Jesus stood to read in the synagogues, he was given a passage from the book of Isaiah, which glows with the message of God's goodness and compassion. There He found the perfect description of the mission He was called to fulfill; to preach the good news to the poor, to set at liberty the oppressed, and to proclaim a good year to the Lord.

It is imperative to teach the Gospel conclusively. First, Jesus came with good news, not bad news. The Gospel is good news for everybody, but especially the poor. Who are the poor? They are those who realize their sinfulness and are thirsting for God's love and mercy. They will ultimately receive these gifts in abundance. It is not a question of whether one deserves them. To receive them is not a sign of our worthiness but God's goodness. This, of course, was a terrible blow to people like the Pharisees, who were convinced that one can be one's own light and one's own justification and that God is there only to issue confirmation on one's own justification.

However, the good news must not be limited to spiritual blessings only. The poor are all the wounded and little ones; the blind, the oppressed, the captives, and all those who are waiting for the liberator. Jesus did not come to minister to the wealthy, who are bloated with pride and the conviction of their virtue and do not see themselves as sinners in need of redemption. There is no liberation for those who rely on things that counted for nothing with Jesus and think they deserve it before everybody else. "Happy are you who are poor; yours is the kingdom of heaven" (Lk 6:60). Amen.





LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

People can easily lose a sense of the sacred and transcendent. When we lose a sense of God's special presence, we need to be brought back. Ezra brought people back to the word of God and they realized what they were missing. Jesus proclaims God's word in the synagogue with true conviction and tells those gathered that he is the fulfillment of all that Isaiah taught. Even though people get lost, distracted, discouraged, and often journey down the wrong path, God's timeless law remains. When we allow ourselves to truly hear God's word and act on it, that living word slowly, over time, changes us. It has the power to soften and mold us, creating within us a joyful spirit. We realize the truth in what God speaks and become open to God's love. Gradually and gently God leads us back where we belong. We discover again the sacred character of life and the wonder of God's power. It is no wonder that Luke addresses his remarks to Theophilus. It is a name that means "beloved of God," a name that can be used by anyone who desires friendship with God.



SAINT OF THE WEEK


One of the most famous members of the Dominican Order, St. Thomas Aquinas (1225 -1274) is well-known by many for his theological work, "The Summa Theologiae." Born in Italy, his mother wanted him to become a Benedictine and had high hopes that he would eventually become abbot of Monte Cassino, where he spent much of his youth. To change his vocation, she had him kidnapped by his brothers on his way to Paris at the age of 19. He spent two years in their captivity. Despite this, nothing could shake him from his vocation to become a Dominican priest and he was eventually released. Once free, he went to Paris and then to Cologne, where he finished his studies with Albert the Great.

His greatest contribution to the Catholic Church is his writings. The unity, harmony, and continuity of faith and reason, of revealed and natural human knowledge, encompasses his writings. The Summa Theologiae, his last and, unfortunately, uncompleted work, deals with the whole of Catholic theology.

The patron saint of teachers, theologians and students, St. Thomas Aquinas died in 1274. His life and the impact he had on the whole Church, however, remains alive today.

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.







