A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

"In old age they will still bear fruit" (Ps 92:15). These words are glad tidings, a true "gospel" that we all can proclaim on this second World Day for Grandparents and the Elderly. Pope Francis has established World Day for Grandparents on July 24 to honor all grandparents and elderly, who are so important to our families, our communities, and our Church. May God continue to bless all grandparents and the elderly and may they continue to pass on the treasure of faith to our grandchildren and the younger generations.

SEVENTEENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

The readings for Mass this Sunday reveal a very different picture of what we do when we pray. Prayer is not about somehow getting hold of God, putting God to work for us, but being drawn beyond ourselves into friendship with God. In the readings, we see two people praying. In our Old Testament reading, we see Abraham, who, according to the Letter of St. James, was called "the friend of God" because of his great faith and good deeds. This friend of God is allowed to interrogate God about God's plans for Sodom and Gomorrah and to badger God concerning the fate of any just people who may live in these allegedly sinful cities. After quite a bit of negotiation, the Lord reassures his friend Abraham that even if only ten just people are left, he will hold back his hand rather than destroy the cities. This prayer of Abraham, the friend of God, reveals the justice of God, the God who will not punish innocent people and those who are wicked. This God listens to the concerns of Abraham that justice is done and reassures him.

In the Gospel, we see an even deeper intimacy than God's with Abraham. Jesus prays as more than a friend: he is the eternal Son of God who has been made flesh; he prays with the closeness of a relationship at the very heart of God, the Holy Trinity. He calls God "Abba, Father," a name that reveals his incredible intimacy with God the Father. If we follow significant moments in his life: before choosing the 12 apostles; on the mountain, transfigured in glory; in the garden of Gethsemane. Then Finally, on the cross, he prays: "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit."

According to Luke, it's Jesus' final journey to Jerusalem that the disciples, seeing him at prayer, ask to be included, to be able to pray as Jesus prays. In response, he teaches them what we know as the Lord's Prayer, the "Our Father." And this prayer of Jesus is something that we are all invited to become part of our baptism onwards when we are made adopted children of the Father, brothers, and sisters of Jesus.

There is no absent God, no far away God, but the God who is with us and loves us. We can't control or manipulate this God, but that isn't why we pray. Praying, for Christians, is about becoming part of the deep communion and love of the Father and the Son in the Holy Spirit.

Jesus tells us: "Ask, and it will be given to you; search, and you will find; knock, and the door will be opened to you." So we are encouraged to keep asking and persevere in bringing our wants and needs before the Father. We do this not so that we can twist God's arm in an emergency – a bit like the pull cord in railway carriages: "In case of emergency, pull the cord"—but so that we may rest the whole of our lives, our tragedies, our sorrows and our joys, our desires and our hope for ourselves and others, upon the mercy of God, the Father of Jesus and our Father. And, in sharing in the prayer life of Jesus, we can grow closer and closer in friendship with him and know the wonder and intimacy of the loving communion of God the Holy Trinity, who is never absent or far away but remain with us forever. Amen.





Saint of the Week

Saint James the Apostle is also called James, son of Zebedee, or James the Greater to distinguish him from the other James in Jesus' group of twelve. Most of what we know about Saint James is recorded in the New Testament. He and his brother John were collected by Jesus along the sea of Galilee. Matthew 4:18-22 tells the story of Jesus calling first Simon Peter and his brother Andrew and then the sons of Zebedee. In Mark 3:17 the brothers receive a nickname from Jesus who calls them "sons of thunder" because of their many extreme reactions, like that in Luke 9:54 when they offer to call down fire on a Samaritan village. Saint James was part of Jesus' intimate circle, a witness to the Transfiguration, the resurrection of Jarius' daughter, and the agony in the garden of Gethsemane. In A.D. 44 Herod Agrippa had "James, the brother of John, killed by the sword." (Acts 12:2) He is the only apostle whose martyrdom is written of in the New Testament.

According to Spanish tradition, his body was taken to Santiago de Compostela, Spain where his relics were rediscovered in 9th century. This tradition has sometimes been attributed to a passage in the Song of Roland which tells of St. James appearing to Charlemagne in a dream, prophesying that Charlemagne would conquer the Moors in Spain. This was followed by a vision of stars which if followed would lead to the saint's lost tomb. In the Middle Ages Compostela was a hugely popular pilgrimage site. The saint's relics continue to rest in the cathedral there and one can still undertake the pilgrimage.



Amen.




National Family Planning Awareness Week (July 24-30, 2022)

BLESSED SACRAMENT IS AT THE HEART OF SWORSHIP SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


