A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

Once again, we would like to congratulate our First Communicants for the past two weekends. We invite and encourage you to come to the Sunday Liturgies of the parish community and receive Jesus in Holy communion together with your parents, family and relatives, and friends and neighbors.

Similarly, our Confirmandi has been sealed with the Gift of the Holy Spirit by His Excellency, Bishop David O'Connell, in the sacrament of Confirmation. We recommend and advise them to our Sunday Masses and continue manifest in their lives how to live a good Christian life.

FEAST OF THE MOST HOLY TRINITY

There's an interesting story of St. Patrick when he was evangelizing in Ireland and had some difficulty explaining the mystery of the Holy Trinity: three Persons in One God. So, he had recourse to shamrock growing around. He would hold a shamrock leaf aloft and ask, 'Is it one leaf or three? His audience would reply: "It is one and three." "So, with God," Patrick would reply.

There is no doubt that our faith experience is a dynamic process. There are always new truths to discover about God, as it happens in developing a love relationship. The Apostles, even though they had lived with Jesus for quite some time, understood hardly anything of him. Jesus knew that they could not accept all that he wanted to tell them. So, they were asked to wait for the coming of the Spirit of truth. The Spirit who would guide them into the fulness of truth. The Apostles' experience should warn us not to consider our faith something static, acquired once and for all.

How often has it not been asked, "Why this incredible revelation of the Unity and Trinity of God?" Was the mystery of the God of Israel, so near yet so transcendent, so loving and terrible, not sufficient to put our minds and hearts in the crisis? Wasn't it enough for us to experience the merciful benign God. A God so slow to anger and rich in mercy, and at the same time witness innocent people suffering – from Abel to our own time; or observe the agony of the praying believer in front of the silence of God. As we note in many psalms and even in the prayer of Jesus on the Cross: 'Why hast Thou forsaken Me?'

And yet, the mystery of the Trinity is the most beneficial revelation of the innermost life of God. Though with our puny minds, we cannot comprehend this august mystery, the Trinitarian life of God is decisive for our life. We can only receive this mystery with pure hearts and humble intelligence; it will remain infinitely beyond our capacity to grasp. With a clear awareness of these limitations and serene confidence in the reasons of the heart and light of faith, we should meditate on what the Holy Trinity means to us.

God has so loved the world as to give us his only Son. In giving his Son, he has shown himself because the Father and the Son are one in perfect communion; they are one in the Spirit. The Holy Spirit is at the origin of the mutual love relationship between the Father and the Son. And the Triune God is the first beginning and the last end of Christian living.

Many seem to believe that two people are enough for love, for example, a beautiful married life. But if this love is not open to welcome and cherish another person - a new life—it is a selfish love, and it is incomplete. True love is generative and creative. It is other-oriented, be it at the Divine or the human level. God is three because God is love. "Intimate mystery of the Trinity; each person is the perfect transparency of the other. Here Jesus reveals to us that the Spirit enters this inter-play of total transparency. The love relationship between the Three Persons has no hiding place. None of the Three keeps anything as 'His own'; everything is shared, communicated, given, welcomed, and received... Our human words are incapable of expressing the ineffable quality of the relationship which makes the Father, Son, and Spirit One.

O Divine Trinity, ocean of love, may I be immersed in You. Amen.



Saint of the Week

Saint Germaine was born in Pibrac, France in 1579 to poor parents. Her story is a heart wrenching one. She was born with a deformed right arm and hand, and her mother died when she was an infant. Her father remarried, but her stepmother brutally abused and neglected her.

As a child Germaine suffered from scrofula, a disfiguring form of tuberculosis which causes swelling and lesions on the side of the neck. Already sick, abused, and starving, she was forced to sleep in barn with sheep she tended.

Despite everything, Germaine lived each day tending her flock with joy and in prayer. Mary and Jesus became her friends. She shared what little she had and taught the children of the village about God's love. A rosary made of string knots was her constant companion. She attended Mass every day, leaving her sheep in care of guardian angels. Her flock was never attacked by wolves and never wandered. Some claimed to see the waters of the flooded river part so she could get to Mass.

She is often portrayed with an apron full of flowers because one winter day her stepmother accused her of stealing bread from the house and hiding it her apron. But when she was seized and forced to open the apron an abundance of spring flowers tumbled forth. It was this incident that compelled the villagers and even her parents to recognize her holiness. Germaine died at 22, her poor body was found by her father, in the barn where she slept. She was buried in the village church. More than forty years later, her body was accidentally exhumed and found to be incorrupt. She was canonized by Pope Pius IX in 1867 and inscribed into the canon of virgins.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

Encourage Deeper Understanding of Scripture

In creative celebration of the Most Holy Trinity, pray a rosary with creation. Find a quiet place outside or sit near a window. Contemplate the amazing Divine Gift that is before you. Admire it. Study it. Become one with it. Ask for the guidance of Brother St. Francis as you pray: "You, Holy Father, are King of heaven and earth. You are three in one, God above all gods. You are good, all good, and supreme good, Lord God, living and true. You are love. You are beauty. You are gentleness. You are joy. You are hope and happiness." Admire the wonder and majesty of God in all that is around you. Ask for wisdom and understanding.

Begin each decade with the Our Father and conclude with the Glory Be.

Decade one: Contemplate God the Father. As you pray each bead with a Hail Mary, get lost in the grandeur of all that you see. Imagine the thousands and thousands of years of history that is before you. Envision a time when nothing existed. What is nothing? Lift your eyes, heart, and soul to the power and magnificence of the universe, its expanse and its endlessness. You are one with it all. God's creative power.

Decade two: Contemplate God the Son. Behold the squirrels, birds, and critters all conducting life's business. They have heartbeats just like yours. Praying each bead, become one with the incarnate divine life that flows through you and flows with the smallest of creatures. It is holy innocence and blessed life. Tenderness. Compassion, Mercy. Reverence. All want to be held, have a home, and be loved. God in all things. Emmanuel.

Decade three: Contemplate God the Holy Spirit. The changing of times and seasons happens often without notice. It is all within God's care and guided. We all belong. Behold the living, dying, and rising to new life. You are one with all time from beginning into eternity.

Decade Four: Contemplate God as One.

Decade Five: Contemplate God as three. All different while remaining one. The divine dance is being danced before you. Rest in what you see. Become what you see. We are all connected: God of the Holy Trinity, creation, our brothers and sisters, the animals, and the plants.

The rosary you have prayed celebrates the circle of connectedness and the intimate relationship we share with all things: a glimpse of the Trinity.

"But when he comes. the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth. He will not speak on his own. but he will speak what he hears, and will declare to you the things that are coming. He will glorify me, because he will take from what is mine and declare it to you." - Jn 16:13-14

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Low Gluten Host


REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.

VOLUNTEERS NEEDED FOR JAIL & PRISON MINISTRY

Did you know that inmates in the prisons in NJ have not had Catholic religious services since March of 2020 due to COVID restrictions? That's more than 2 years without seeing a priest, receiving Holy Communion, or going to the Sacrament of Confession.

The prisons are gradually reopening to pastoral visitors, but many of our longtime volunteers have passed away, retired, or moved away. We need to rebuild the ministry. There is urgent need for Priests, Deacons, Lay Ministers of the Eucharist, and possibly RCIA Instructors.




