## A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

#### HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!

A small boy who had been like Dennis the Menace all day was saying bedtime prayers with his dad. After a short prayer, the little boy asked his dad to leave him alone so he could talk to God by himself. Dad asked, "What have you done that you don't want me to know about?" "If I tell you," the boy said, "you'll get angry and shout and yell, but God will listen, forgive me and forget about it." Happy Father's Day to all our Fathers - whether actual fathers or those who play the role of a father in someone's life. As we celebrate Father's Day this weekend, we will honor, pray and bless all the fathers in all Masses.

#### THE MOST HOLY BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

In Ancient times, meals were regarded as very significant occasions. In Old Testament times, salvation, and heaven were often pictured in terms of a meal, a wonderful banquet with abundant food and drink for everyone. Our first reading tells us of Melchizedek, a priest, and king who brought bread and wine to welcome Abraham and honor him as one blessed by God.

For Jesus, meals were very significant. There are many occasions in the Gospels where we see Jesus involved in sharing food and drink with his friends or with people in general. And he uses those occasions for much of his teaching. Today's Gospel recounted an event when Jesus fed a huge crowd of over five thousand people with a few loaves and fishes. All had enough to eat; there were no fewer than twelve baskets of leftovers. This incident in Jesus' life was so significant that the Gospel writers tell of it more than six times in the four Gospels. It was not simply the miracle that filled them with astonishment. Still, what it pointed to: before the feeding, Jesus had been healing sick people and teaching them about the kingdom of God. The healing, teaching, and feeding together illustrated what the kingdom means, as God meets the needs of the whole person, body, and soul.

But even that is not the whole story. In giving their accounts, the Gospel writers seem to have something more in mind. They are also focusing on what happened later in the story, the night before Jesus died. It was then, as today's 2nd reading reminds us, that Jesus instituted the Eucharist; he gave us the Mass and Holy Communion. The central act of Christian worship for all time would be in the form of a sacred meal, a banquet where Jesus would nourish his followers on his own body and blood. That meal would itself be a foreshadowing of the banquet of heaven. In today's Gospel, Luke seems to go out of his way to show this close connection between the feeding of the crowds and the Eucharist in the way he tells the story. As he describes how Jesus took the loaves, blessed them, broke them, and gave them. These four actions—taking, blessing, breaking, and giving—are the actions of Jesus at the Last Supper. Of course, they are the actions that we witness and participate in every Mass, most notably in our parish community of St. Catherine's. You could say that they provide a brief description of the Mass.

Thus, today we are celebrating and sharing a more wonderful meal than the one described in today's Gospel. But as we do so, we are also experiencing a challenge. To receive the body given for us and the blood shed for us is to be called to follow the example of Jesus' total self-giving. To be fed by sacred food is to be strengthened to live holy lives devoted to God and our brothers and sisters. To be nourished by one who lays down his life for us is to prepare ourselves to make sacrifices. To be invited as a guest to the table of the Eucharist is to be invited to share with others.

Therefore, as often been said, the Mass matters. It's at the center of our Christian life and witness. And it calls us to live in tune with the sacred meal set before us. Amen.








## Saint of the Week

Sir Thomas More was a humanist and statesman in Tudor England. He is still widely known today as the author of Utopia. More was a prolific writer and theologian. A true martyr of the Church, he was beatified by Pope Leo XIII in 1886, and canonized by Pope Pius XI on May 19, 1935. More was born in London in 1478, the son of Sir John More, a lawyer and judge. He attended Oxford where he studied Latin and Greek, as well as formal logic. He left Oxford in 1494 to train as a lawyer in London. After attaining the Bar, he spent time discerning a call to the priesthood. Though attracted to the Franciscan order More remained a lay Christian, continuing to fast, pray, and wear a hair shirt. He was married twice, the loving father of three daughters, a stepdaughter by his second marriage, and one son. More wrote many letters to his children when he was away on business and his daughters were known for their academic abilities, as they received the same education as his son, an anomaly at the time.

More rose to the Privy Council in 1514. He became the good friend and advisor to Henry VIII, and in 1521 he was knighted. In 1529 he was made Lord Chancellor of England. However, this appointment was the beginning of the end for the saint. He could not support the break with the Church in Rome when Henry failed to receive from the Pope the annulment of his first marriage to Katherine of Aragon to wed Anne Boleyn. More resigned as Lord Chancellor and continued to refuse to accept Henry as the head of the Church in England. Eventually he was imprisoned, tried, and sentenced to a traitor's death, to be hanged, drawn, and quartered. Henry commuted the sentence of his former friend to the more humane beheading. More was executed at Tower Hill, on July 6, 1535, before his death he famously proclaimed that he was "the king's good servant, but God's first."





May your church never lose sight of these, your special sons, and may we, the body of Christ, never fail to cherish the gift of their lives, which they have freely given to you and your holy church.



## SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

## Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

### A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.


#### **REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH**

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.




