# A Message from our Pastor

### Dear Friends in Christ,

We are so glad to experience and see the great response of everyone when we announced the appeal for the suffering people of Ukraine. Together with Pope Francis and Bishop David, we call for your continuous fervent prayers and generous support as the war is still ongoing. More and more people have died, been hurt, and displaced, and there's a lot of uncertainty for them. The whole world is watching, and thankfully other countries are so caring and compassionate for the refugees. In solidarity with those who offer humanitarian help, let us continue giving what we can offer in terms of money or in-kind. As we have announced, please call or email us, and we will be more than happy to answer you. And to those who have graciously given their support, we thank you so much.

The season of Lent is an excellent opportunity to be mindful of our weaknesses, failures, and transgressions. Everyone is busy, but we must exert extra effort, give our precious time, and come back to the Lord. Our parish is scheduled to hear confessions on Monday, at 4:30 P.M. and 6:00 P.M., and Tuesday at 4:30 P.M. (March 14-15). Our religious education students are with us for their Sacrament of Reconciliation on those abovementioned days. We have invited some priests to help us hear confessions and give absolution. We look forward to seeing you in the Church.

### SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

A doctor once said to his patient, "You will pull through, but you are a very sick man." The patient replied, "Please, doctor, do everything you can for me. If I get well, I will donate fifty thousand dollars to the fund for the new hospital." Several months later, when the patient was entirely well, the doctor reminded him: "You said that if you get well, you will donate fifty thousand dollars?" The former patient replied, "If I ever said that, then I really must have been very sick."

Promises made in storms are often forgotten in the calm, even if it there were good intentions. Don't you find examples of this in your life? Yes, you and I, in challenging moments, in trying circumstances, when we find that even the most trusted ones cannot help us, make many solemn promises to God. But when we are out of trouble, when we experience peace and calm again, we quickly tend to forget our promises.

What about God's promises? Are they like human promises? No, not at all. God's promises are not like ours. He made a promise to Abraham that he would have many descendants and possess a land of plenty, and He did fulfill it. Ordinarily, the weaker partner in the contract must accept more obligations than the stronger one. But in the covenant with Abraham, God bore the brunt of the obligations, promising unconditional faithfulness. Faithfulness even in the face of our gross unfaithfulness.

Abraham had an earnest desire for something more precious than the comfort and security of his family life. Or else, he would have remained there when the Lord called him out. He opened his heart to the word of God and took it seriously. He was daring enough to be ready to sacrifice even his son, to be faithful to God. God rewarded him with an ever-vibrant faith and enabled him to experience His power and glory in the various events of his daily life. Moreover, he had a glimpse of the world beyond.

The transfiguration of Jesus has a message of great significance. It reveals the real meaning of Jesus' life and that of our own life. Here, on earth, Jesus lived an extraordinarily simple, humble life. But his life was the divine event towards which all creation had been moving and in which God was acting for the world's salvation. Peter, James, and John were given a simple glimpse of that reality. The real meaning of our lives here on earth is evident in the words of St. Paul when he says: "Our citizenship is in heaven, and from heaven comes the Savior we are waiting for, the Lord Jesus Christ, And He will transfigure these wretched bodies of ours into copies of His glorious body." Amen.



### SAINT OF THE WEEK

Whether you know him as the man who brought Christianity to Ireland or simply as a reason you eat corned beef and cabbage in March, St. Patrick (415 – 493) is a well-known saint around the world.

St. Patrick was born in Britain of a Romanized family. At the age of 16, he was kidnapped by Irish raiders from the villa of his father, a deacon and local official, and brought into slavery in Ireland. He spent six long years there as a herdsman, during which he turned to his faith for strength. He later escaped back to Britain on a ship, where he was eventually reunited with his family.

His years of captivity changed him and brought out a zeal for God and a yearning to spread the message of Jesus Christ. Despite the constant danger of martyrdom, he continued to travel throughout Ireland where he baptized and confirmed in the name of Christ.

### **Lenten Regulations**

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

OFFICE OF THE BISHOP

During the days and weeks of penance that lie ahead --- from *Ash Wednesday, March 2, 2022 until Holy Thursday, April 14, 2022* --- the Catholic Church throughout the world commemorates the penitential season of Lent ending with the Sacred Triduum of Holy Week. The model Jesus gave us for "these forty days" was his own experience in the desert and the temptations that followed him there where he encountered Satan face to face. And yet, Jesus, there in the desert --- alone, fasting and in intense prayer --- beat back the devil and triumphed over temptation, as strong and as unrelenting as it was throughout those forty days.

We enter the desert of Lent like Jesus, led by the Holy Spirit, to face our devils, our temptations head on. But we are not alone. The Lord Jesus Christ is with us. And so, too, is the Church, the entire community of faith observing Lent. Here is what the Catholic Church in the United States requires of us as baptized Catholics:

The days of FAST (only one full meal) and ABSTINENCE (no meat) are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. No dispensations are granted on these solemn days except for reason of sickness or those provided in canon law below. The pastor of a parish has the authority to give a dispensation to individual parishioners in his parish. The Bishop alone has the authority to dispense groups of Catholics but only for a serious reason.

Those who are automatically dispensed from fast and abstinence regulations outside the age limits noted below include: the physically or mentally ill, especially individuals suffering from chronic illnesses such as diabetes. Also included n the dispensation are women who are pregnant or nursing. In all cases, common sense should prevail and ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops).

Those between the ages of 18 and 59 are obliged to FAST (only one full meal) as above. From the age of 14, people are also obliged to ABSTAIN (no meat: this obligation prohibits the eating of meat, but not eggs, milk products or condiments of any kind, even though made from animal fat).

The obligation to observe the laws of fast and abstinence is a serious one for Catholics. Failure to observe one penitential day in itself is not considered a serious sin. It is the intentional failure to observe any penitential days at all, or a substantial number of penitential days, that must be considered a serious matter.

The obligation, the privilege really, of receiving the Eucharist at least once a year --- often called "Easter duty" --- for those in the state of grace should still be fulfilled during the period from the **First Sunday of Lent, March 5-6, 2022 to Trinity Sunday, June 12, 2022.** However, the Church's law does permit this precept to be fulfilled at another time during the year when there is a just cause.

I want to encourage all Catholics, especially those conscious of serious sin, to go to confession and to make use of the sacrifices and traditions that have always been part of our Lenten practices in the Church.

We do, indeed, fast and pray with the Lord Jesus and with our fellow Catholics. May this Lent be a time of penance leading to grace and joy for us all at Easter.

# SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

# Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

# A sponsor must be registered at St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now lives elsewhere</u>, he/she is not a member of this <u>parish</u>. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.







