A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we started our parish Religious Education Program four weeks ago, we are glad to see the students and their parents attend our Sunday Liturgies. Today, let us welcome with a communitarian spirit our seventh and eighth graders at the 11:30 A.M. celebration of the Mass. As one family of God in St. Catherine, it is our joy to be with them as they prepare for the reception of the Sacrament of Confirmation next year in Spring. We are also asked to pray that these young candidates will be ready as they are being formed and catechized in our Religious Education classes to have the full communion with the Catholic faith as they are the future of the Church. Let us include in our prayers their teachers and catechists who devote their time and talent in this most important effort.

THIRTY THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

It is related by somebody that in Japan during the time of Christian persecution, there was a married couple, together with their 6-year-old daughter Anne. Since they were Christians, they had a premonition they would suffer martyrdom and felt very sorry for their little daughter. The called her one day and said, "Little Anne, we will soon die martyrs, what are you going to do without us?"

The girl, as if inspired by God, said, "You are going to be martyrs in heaven? I will be a martyr like you and will go to heaven with you." With that she ran to pick up her toys and give them to her friends, saying: "I'm saying goodbye now because I am going to heaven."

Today the Lord, while giving us a final warning about dire persecutions and severe trials, leaves us with a consoling and reassuring message of his protection and assistance. Trials and tribulations will come as acid tests of our loyalty to Christ.

To help us to be honest with ourselves in our stocktaking, we are reminded that one day this world will come to an end. It will be followed immediately by the general judgment. Christ will come in power and glory to judge the whole human race. Each one will enjoy and suffer accordingly.

Christ comes to us in many ways; though the Scriptures, and through the preachers. We must not resist his first humble coming, and then we shall not have cause to fear his second glorious coming. The man who is free from anxiety waits for the coming of his Lord without fear.

The question raised by the disciples expresses the ever-present human anxiety: When? We want to know the time and date in order to overcome our anguish. This attitude comes from fear and lack of confidence in our destiny planned by God. It is true that we may experience hardships of war, of hatred in the family, and the anxieties of life which seems to have lost all sense. All these are signs that we are engaged in a decisive battle and the anguish of the times that are coming to a close. But Jesus assures us, "Don't worry." However disastrous things on earth may seem on account of social insecurity, political unrest, etc., the disciples of Christ need not be shaken. Their stability is based on the presence of Christ with them, who assured us, "Not a hair of your head will perish."

To be loyal to Christ we may have to let go of everything and everyone, literally. It is terrible, it is frightening. But it is consoling as well. For the total gift of self to Christ is matched with the total gift of life, glorious life, with Christ.

Jesus, my divine Master, may I be loyal to you even in minute details of my life. Amen.




SAINT OF THE WEEK

Saint Margaret was born in exile around 1045, in what is now Hungary. She is the daughter of Princess Agatha of Hungary and Edward the Atheling the Anglo-Saxon heir to the throne of England. The family returned to England, but Edward died soon after their arrival, making Margaret's brother Edgar the presumptive heir. However, the Norman Conquest would turn their world upside down. Agatha and her children fled the country. They likely intended to go back to Hungary, but they were shipwrecked off the coast of Scotland.

King Malcolm Canmore III took the exiles under his wing, and he fell in love with the beautiful and gracious Margaret. Although she initially rebuffed his proposals, the couple were married in 1070 at castle of Dunfermline. Margaret and Malcolm had eight children, six sons and two daughters. Margaret brought culture to the Scottish court and used her influence to soften her rough husband. The saint led a life of austerity, aiding Church reform, promoting Easter communion, and founding churches and monasteries. She instituted the Queen's Ferry to the shrine of St. Andrew and founded pilgrimage hostels.

Saint Margaret, Queen of Scotland, died on November 16,1093, four days after her husband and eldest son were killed in the battle of Alnwick. She was canonized by Pope Innocent IV in 1250 and named patron of Scotland in 1673.



Traveling Exhibit—Blessed Carlo Acutis

"Eucharistic Miracles"

NOVEMBER 6—NOVEMBER 27

This traveling exhibit by the Diocese of Trenton has been created to assist those who experience it to affirm belief in the Real Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. It is based upon the website created by Blessed Carlos Acutis to catalogue all of the eucharistic miracles that have taken place worldwide.

The exhibit is circular and is divided into sections or rooms in which information about the Eucharistic miracles is displayed. Each panel names a miracle, recounts the story of its occurrence and the country where it took place. The panels are arranged in chronological order from the early Third Century to 2013.

Blessed Carlo Acutis died of leukemia in 2006 at the age of 15. Blessed Carlo was a "normal kid" in every way, but also developed a deep devotion to the Holy Eucharist at an early age. He was beatified in 2020, putting him on the path to becoming the first millennial Saint. Earlier this year, Bishop David O'Connell named Blessed Carlo the patron of all Catholic Schools and young people in the Trenton Diocese.



SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.
