A Message from Fr. Angelito

Dear Friends in Christ,

Allow me to share with you some good news! Some of our parishioners are asking about the Parish Choir, when it will return, the intentions, and other relevant questions about this matter. Since Covid-19 is slowing down, we are praying for the



Parish's Choir, and they are on our agenda. Please be patient and stay tuned for further information.

The Church's calendar begins with the season of Advent today, the beginning of the Year of Grace. Regarding the liturgical year, the Lectionary cycles are as follows: YEAR A: Sunday cycle; and Cycle 1: Weekday cycle (Ordinary Time).

Please be mindful that Advent is two-fold; it is a time of preparation for the Solemnities of Christmas, in which we remember the First Coming of the Son of God to humanity. And likewise, a time when, by the remembrance of this, minds and hearts are led to look forward to Christ's Second Coming at the end of time. For these two reasons, Advent is a period of devout and expectant delight.

We will place an Advent Wreath, a popular symbol in many churches, in the Church's sanctuary, and at the Chapel. Each Sunday, we will light a candle on the wreath. The candles on the Advent wreath symbolize hope, love, joy, and peace. The candles are lit in that order beginning today.

FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT

In our lives, we secure ourselves against the storms and challenges of life by grounding ourselves on the Word of God, which is a rock foundation. We sometimes need to understand, we must trust and hold God's hand to have peace during these challenges and storms.

The here and now fascinates us and claims our attention. We are quickly engrossed in the present. Seldom, if ever, do we think of death. Jesus insists that we be constantly alert and awake, for no one knows when death will come. Watchfulness or vigilance is very difficult for us as we easily get tired of watching and waiting.

Advent is a time of waiting and expectation. It is a good reminder. See how attractively and graphically Jesus describes Christian waiting. He compares himself to a bridegroom, and us, his disciples, to brides waiting in joyful, eager expectation for the bridegroom to come and knock at the door. Which bride would not eagerly wait for such a beloved?

The first Sunday of the liturgical year sets our sights on life's ultimate horizon----when Christ comes to us again. What will his second coming be like? For those eagerly awaiting his coming, He will come as "light, love, and life." But He will come as a stern judge for those "sleeping" or living licentious lives.

When Christ the Judge comes, he will strip away our masks. Our approach toward his coming indicates his judgments on our lives. On that day, will we be ready to leap joyfully toward the waiting arms of God? Or will we have to hide away in the darkness, wallowing in guilt for our sins of commission and omission? It depends on you and me; it all depends on our choices today.

We know neither the day nor the hour of his coming. We can only say with hope. "Soon!" Only one thing is sure in this life: all of us will die. Assured of the reality of death, we can only reaffirm the message of Advent; "Stay awake...watch," because Christ is undoubtedly coming.

Dear Jesus, amid my busy life schedule, help me to halt a while and listen to you, to be attentive towards your presence as a brother and a friend. Amen.



LIVE THE LITURGY

Inspiration for the week

Whether it is the surgeon performing an operation or the pilot directing a flight, one expects them to be alert. When we entrust our lives to someone, we presume that they will attend to them with the utmost care and vigilance. If we have this expectation of others, why would we not have it of ourselves? Our lives are precious vessels on an eternal journey. We can only stay afloat and on the course because of God's love and mercy. It is easy to get distracted, lazy, preoccupied, and tired. Apathy can wreak havoc on the most dedicated of souls. God's word transforms all that it touches, even a lukewarm heart. Let us seek God's grace this Advent season so that we can walk more fully in His light. Then, finding ourselves more attentive, focused, alert, and watchful, we will be eager and well prepared to meet our Lord when He comes. Why would we not want to be ready, awake, and watchful for the One we have waited for so long?



Saint Andrew was a fisherman in Galilee, along with his brother, Peter, when they were called by Jesus to leave their boat and become fishers of men. John's Gospel also places him as a follower of John the Baptist before he came to be one of Jesus' twelve Disciples. Beyond the scant references in the Gospels, not much is known of Saint Andrew's life.

According to Christian tradition Saint Andrew, like many of his fellow Disciples, went out into Greece and Turkey to preach the Good News. A 4th century account of the saint's life tells of his martyrdom by crucifixion in Patras. Medieval accounts describe the cross used as X-shaped because Andrew said he was not worthy to die on the same style of cross as Jesus.

Famously, Saint Andrew is the patron Saint of Scotland, the country's flag bearing the X-shaped cross associated with him. Legends claim that the saint either traveled to Scotland to spread the Gospel or that his relics were brought there by St. Regulus who had a vision telling him to take the bones to the end of the earth. Regulus set out and was shipwrecked on the coast of Scotland. Today relics of St. Andrew which had been held by the Vatican are now at a shrine in Patras.



SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago <u>but now</u> <u>lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this</u> <u>parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in</u> <u>whose territory he/she resides</u>. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.
