THIRTY FIRST SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

God does not punish the wicked and the sinners; instead, He spares them. He is merciful and merciful not only to the sinners in Israel but to sinners everywhere. He is merciful because he loves. Because He loved everything, he created everything, and because he loves, he sustains everything in life.

We heard the story of Zacchaeus in the Gospel. His story illustrates all truths. Zacchaeus is a despicable person for others, but not for Jesus, the Son of God, Lover of Life. For Jesus came that we may have life, life in abundance (Jn. 10:10). Therefore, Jesus cannot but save him. For he is not just a hated tax collector. That is his accidental and superficial self. His authentic, God-given self-identity is this: as a son of Abraham. However, one may disfigure and even destroy oneself. Deep down, we are children of God-created, loved, sustained, held by God, the lover of life. Jesus assured Zacchaeus, "Today, salvation has come to this house." Salvation, in simple language, means fullness of life, sharing to one's maximum capacity of God's own life and love, God's friendship.

Satan, the enemy of God, man, and life, deceives us. The result is sin. Sin separates us from God and damages or destroys our life and friendship with God, the lover of life. The second reading gives us more thoughts and relevant words. "That's why we always pray for you. We ask our God to make you worthy of the life he has called you to live. May he fulfill all your desire and goodness by his power and complete your work in faith."

God's glory is man fully alive. -St. Irenaeus. Lord and lover of life, instill in me a love for life. Amen.




2022 ALL SAINTS DAY & ALL SOULS DAY SCHEDULE OF MASSES

SAINT OF THE WEEK


Saint Wolfgang of Ratisbon (now Regensburg) was born around 934 in Swabia, Germany. The son of a wealthy family, he was tutored in the home before he studied at the Monastery of Reichenau and Wurtzburg. In 956 he elected to go to Trier with his friend, Henry, who was appointed archbishop there. Wolfgang served as a teacher in the cathedral school at Trier.

After his friend's death, he became a Benedictine monk joining a monastery in Augsburg. There he led the school which flourished under his hand and was ordained in 968. In 972 he was sent to be a missionary to the pagan Magyar tribes (Hungarian clans). The Christmas of 972 he was appointed Bishop of Regensburg, near Munich, by Emperor Otto II, the post he would hold until his death.

The new Bishop continued to wear his Benedictine habit and held to the austerities of monastic life. He preached and worked at reform and took such care of the poor he was called "the Great Almoner." The saint also tutored the future Holy Roman Emperor, St. Henry II.

Saint Wolfgang died in 994 while traveling Austria, in the town of Puppingen near Linz. He was canonized in 1052.


Liturgical Life

Bishop O'Connell's series on the Eucharist to Jaunch Oct. 18

In a new five-part series on the Eucharist, Bishop David M. O'Connell, C. M., highlights "many aspects of the inexhaustible gift and mystery of the Holy Eucharist as the Body and Blood of the Lord Jesus

Christ drawn from Scripture and Tradition."
Titled "Catechetical Series on the
Eucharist," the segments will begin
Oct. 18, the Feast of St. Luke. An
installment will drop each week
in text, video and podcast across
all diocesan digital platforms.

The entire series will be printed in the November issue of The Monitor Magazine.



The five installments of the series will cover:

Preface and Part One (Oct. 18) • Eucharist as "mystery" and "reality"; faith as a supernatural gift; Jesus' words, "Do this in memory of me," as the institution of the Sacrament of Eucharist

Part Two (Oct. 25) • Catechesis as necessary for belief in the Real Presence of Jesus; Scripture accounts of God's presence among his people

Part Three (Nov. 1) • Excerpts from great theologians, saints, Scripture, emphasizing the unchanging fundamental belief in the Eucharist

Part Four (Nov. 8) • Excerpts from Papal, Vatican II, U.S. Bishop's documents demonstrating continuity and constancy of Eucharistic doctrine

Part Five (Nov. 15) • Eucharistic Lexicon including words, terms and expressions describing or referring to Holy Eucharist or its celebration

SPONSORS FOR THE SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM AND CONFIRMATION

The godparents, together with the parents, must be willing to help the baptized grow in love for Christ and neighbor. By word and example, the godparents will encourage the candidate to live the Christian life and fulfill faithfully the obligations connected with it (cf. Code of Canon Law, c. 872-874).

Requirements to Obtain a Sponsor Certificate/Letters of Eligibility

In St. Catherine's Parish and in all Catholic Parishes in the U.S.

- A sponsor must have received the Sacraments of Baptism, Holy Eucharist, & Confirmation and if married, married in the Catholic Church.
- A sponsor must be at least 16 years of age.
- A sponsor attends Mass faithfully participating in the life and support of the Church, receiving the Eucharist, and leading a life according to the teachings of the Church.

For sponsor requests from St. Catherine', you must be registered at

St. Catherine of Siena Parish and registered for at least six (6) months prior to the request, showing participation in the life & support of the Church.

Note, if he/she received all his/her sacraments here at St. Catherine of Siena Parish years ago but now lives elsewhere, he/she is not a member of this parish. Rather, he/she is a member of the parish in whose territory he/she resides. This is where the sponsor certificate must be obtained.

REASONS WHY TO REGISTER IN THE PARISH

Registration is the official way we join a parish community. Some people think that because they attend a particular parish they automatically belong.

Registration is a commitment to community, a way to be included in the religious, social and ministerial activities of the parish. Registration shows you belong. It is also necessary for certain benefits and administrative purposes, like scheduling sacraments, obtaining a Sponsor/Godparent Certificate and Letter of Eligibility, and donation statements for your income tax returns. Most importantly, it lets the parish count on you, to call on you to assist in its mission.

Registering in the parish is simple. It just requires signing up, formally enrolling yourself by contacting the Parish Office. Young adults 18 and over who are still living at home with their parents, or attend college, are recommended to register in their own name. Thank You.

The Message is Shared in Age-Appropriate Ways

Children **ages 4 – 8** gather together to attend our Children's Liturgy of the Word, sometimes called CLOW. The program lets children listen to the readings at age appropriate level and use coloring sheets as a way to emphasize the message of the day's Gospel.

Discovering the Gospel Message

Just before our first reading, the children are called to the front of the church and greeted by our celebrant. They and the Ministry Leader are then dismissed with a blessing to discover what the Gospel message has to say to them. They gather in Classroom 1 for the program. Following the Liturgy of the Word, the children return to their seats in the church to celebrate the Liturgy of the Eucharist with their families.
